Four Diseases Coming Back

It is unfortunate that when health officers in this country nearly wipe out a disease, such as diphtheria or small pox or typhoid fever, people lose their fear of it. Never having seen or heard much of it, they have no knowledge of the terrible epidemics with which it used to kill off hundreds of thousands of people. I was just reading in that splendid little journal, "Science News Letter," that health officers now are alarmed about the upsurge in the incidence of diphtheria, infectious and serum hepatitis, meningitis, and polio. The number of cases of diphtheria has risen by 20 per cent. This, I imagine, means that many mothers are not bothering now to see to it that their small children are given the usual protective injection. When I was a child I had to have diphtheria, just as I had to have the measles, and I all but died of it. Today, it is a rare disease, but still a deadly one.

The incidence of serum hepatitis, or inflammation of the liver, has increased by 50 per cent, and this is bad because, occasionally, the disease does serious damage to the liver, and perhaps brings on a cirrhosis, with all the troubles that can go with that. I suspect that one of the biggest reasons for the great increase in serum hepatitis is the tendency we doctors have had, of late, to give transfusions to many people who probably could have gotten by without them. Some of us doctors are too zealous when it comes to treatment. We feel we should do everything possible to get the patient well, when perhaps he would have done much better with no medicine at all. I so fear transfusions that nobody is ever going to give me one unless I am in a serious state after extensive bleeding, perhaps from a stomach ulcer, or a bad accident.

Vets Pension Act Effective July 1

About 277,000 new persons will become eligible for pension next July 1 when the Veterans Pension act of 1960 becomes effective, according to the Veterans administration. Of the total, about 74 per cent will be widows and children of veterans made eligible by the widow's equalization clause, and 26 per cent will be living veterans, widows and children made eligible by increased income limitation, the VA added.

Iron Pills Beneficial

The other day I saw a woman who told me she had been given a transfusion when her doctor got a report that her blood was down 20 per cent from normal. It never would have occurred to me to give her blood for so slight an anemia. A bottle of iron pills probably would have brought her back to normal. But now, the poor woman is suffering from hepatitis with jaundice, and she may be in for some serious trouble. Another good way of avoiding hepatitis is for us physicians to use the new throw-away hypodermic needles and throw-away lancets. In recent years we have found that it is difficult to get rid of the virus of hepatitis that clings to a lancet. Our old method of throwing needles and lancets into alcohol has been found to be inadequate for sterilization. The virus is hard to kill, even with boiling.

Another cause of serum hepatitis in the past has been the too-common use of bottled blood plasma. Until recently, much of such plasma contained the virus of serum hepatitis. It was impossible either to keep it out or to kill it when it got in. Hence, it was stupid to give plasma for a little wound or a little burn, as was often done. Thank goodness, now, experts have learned that if the plasma is kept in a warm room for some months, the virus is likely to die out.

I don't know why the incidence of meningitis should be going up. Very disturbing is the fact that this year the incidence of severe polio has doubled. As I said, when mothers lose their fear of a disease they stop having their children protected against it.

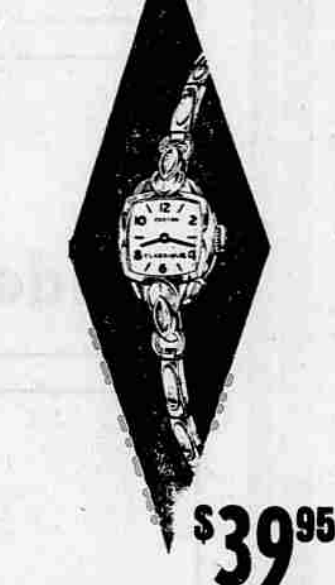

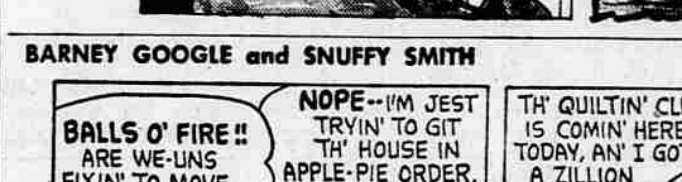
