Ghost Burgers

Where there are pizza-loving teen-agers spooking about, these ghost burgers are ready to take off on a ghostly gallop for party honors. So easy to make!

Make a pizza mixture of ground beef, finely chopped onion, tomato paste, salt and oregano. Spread mixture on cut side of sandwich bun halves and brown in a hot oven for 12 minutes.

Give "pizzas" a spirited look with eerie cheese faces made like this: Cut faces from slices of sharp process cheese, using a paring knife. Place a cheese face over browned meat and return to oven for a minute or two until cheese starts to soften.

Halibut Hawaiian

Plentiful halibut, plentiful Hawaiian spirit, unite in this truly exceptional fish dish as we look for something special to celebrate "Fish 'n' Seafood Parade." Six servings and keep this recipe handy because eaters will ask for it.

- 2 halibut steaks, about 1 pound each, fresh or frozen
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup cooked rice
- 1 cup soft bread cubes
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 cup drained crushed pineapple

- 1/2 teaspoon curry powder
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons butter or other fat, melted
- 3 slices bacon, optional

Thaw steaks, if frozen. Sprinkle with salt. Combine next six ingredients. Place one steak in a well-greased baking pan, 11 x 7 x 1 inch or bigger. Place rice mixture on one steak and cover with the other steak. Brush with butter and lay slices of bacon on top. Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees, for 30 to 40 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork.

Sausage - Apple Burgers

Serve thin sausage patties with rings of candied apples in hot hamburger buns for an unusual and very tempting sandwich.

Omelet Variations For Egg Bargains

Abundant supplies of fine quality eggs continue with prices at relatively low levels. Nutritionwise, eggs are a rich source of the nutrients everyone needs for growth and health.

Surprise omelets have taste-tempting flavor accents tucked inside. For puffy omelets, fold the surprise food into the yolks before the whites. For three-egg surprise omelets, add:

- Bacon—1/4 cup crisp bacon crumbles.
- Cheddar—1/4 cup grated sharp cheddar cheese.
- Chinese—1/4 cup each drained bean sprouts and crisp bacon crumbles.
- Mushroom—1/3 cup chopped or 1/2 cup tiny whole mushrooms.
- Onion—1/4 cup each chopped onion or scallions and chopped parsley.
- Tuna—1/3 cup shredded tuna.

Honey Dressing

Honey Week reminds us of this delightful sweet - sour salad dressing which is just about perfect for desserts made with fruit gelatin and with drained canned fruit cocktail.

Combine one cup dairy sour cream, two tablespoons lemon juice, one-half teaspoon salt and two tablespoons honey. Chill before serving.

When you use honey as the sweetener for fruits, you will find they keep their delicate color and flavor for several hours.

Baked Bananas

Plentiful, bargain-priced bananas make a distinguished accompaniment for meat, poultry. Peel and place whole bananas in a baking dish. Pour two tablespoons fresh orange juice and one teaspoon fresh lemon juice over each banana. Bake in a preheated hot oven, 400 degrees, 10 to 15 minutes. Serve **at once**.
