The Medical Roundup

A Medical Consultation

In the old days when I was a young man and two doctors had a consultation, the incoming consultant first listened to the history given by the family doctor; then he examined the patient; then the two went outside somewhere and had their chat.

Then they came back into the room and the consultant was careful not to say anything which would indicate that his diagnosis was materially different from that of the home doctor. Any consultant who varied from this technic was likely soon to find himself without much of a practice.

Fortunately through the years, more and more physicians, when they have wanted to get a consultant's help, have sent their patient to the consultant's office and have let him make his examination in his own way, with his own technic, his own apparatus, and his own assistants. The consultant has returned the patient to the family doctor with a letter of findings. With this technic, the consultant can satisfy himself about the patient, and the patient can get an honest opinion. The ablest consultant always will be fair and honest with the patient, and will not worry about old-fashioned ideas of medical etiquette. He will feel that when a patient is paying him for an opinion, he should get an honest opinion, even if it is an unpleasant one—as when some serious disease has been found.

When a consultation is to be held in a patient's home or hospital room, I love the fine family doctor who says, "Go ahead and tell my patient what you think—right here—I have no secrets to hide from him. If your diagnosis is different from mine—well and good. I called you to help us because you know much more about this type of illness than I do."

Manned Space Trip Seen 'Unrealistic'

Washington (UPI)—Ballonist Malcolm D. Ross said Thursday that a newly discovered radiation hazard makes manned flight in solar space "appear quite unrealistic" for the time being.

Cmdr. Ross, whose many balloon flights for the Office of Naval Research have made scientific history and won him world acclaim, referred to unpredictable outbursts on the sun which fill solar space with swarms of highly penetrating particles.

This new hazard is in addition to that of the so-called Van Allen belts, zones of energetic particles discovered in the earth's magnetic field by the Explorer satellites and Pioneer moon probes.
