**2nd Franchise In LA Depends Upon O'Malley**

New York—UPI—The question whether Los Angeles will have a second major league baseball franchise apparently boils down to this: Will Dodger President Walter O'Malley share his gold mine?

Stanley Brown, president of the would-be Los Angeles Stars, said Wednesday after conferring with Continental league officials, that Los Angeles may have another franchise "if Mr. O'Malley is willing."

In Los Angeles, O'Malley commented, "no comment." Brown said he was advised by Continental league president Branch Richey that the new circuit would be happy to consider Los Angeles "conditional upon Mr. O'Malley's not being in opposition."

**Eastern Washington SOC Rival Saturday**

Ashland - A well proven defensive team and a surprising passing attack will be displayed Saturday on Fuller field when Southern Oregon college plays host to Eastern Washington college at 8 p.m.

Only three touchdowns can be charged to the Raider defensive team in the past four games while the offensive unit has given up two on a fumble and pass interception.

Led by the only senior member of the unit, Dick (Hughie) Smith, the Raiders have held opponents to a scant 59.6 yards passing and 102.1 yards rushing per game.

Smith leads the big middle three and his hard charging has resulted in one touchdown for SOC and recovered fumbles not to mention the plays that have been stopped before they could barely get started.

Dave Brown and Neil Green along with Pedro Colley make up the bulk of the middle line but defensive ends, John Shama and Larry Drake, take responsibility for turning the outside plays in so the big boys can put the stoppers on.

Shama and Drake solved one of the Raiders biggest problems in the beginning of the season. At first every team the men of SOC met ran them ragged around the flanks. Since then the work of Drake and Shama have turned the tables in favor of Southern Oregon.

Phil Sword, Willie Garner, John Buck and Jess Munyon at their linebacker positions have been responsible for the short passes and helping out the forward wall.

John Harvey, Clark Peterson, Doyle Branson, Kerm Bennett, and now sidelined Wayne Allen have taken over the responsibilities in the backfield. Their play has accounted for 10 pass interceptions. In addition, opponents

have completed only 4.4 passes per game for a total of 31. Thus 25 per cent of enemy completions have been matched by SOC interceptions.

Raider coach Al Akins points not only to this season but also to the future. Nine of the mentioned defensive players are freshmen, four are sophomores, and only two, Smith and Sword, are seniors.

Offensively the Raiders will go with Eldon Francis, Branson, and Al (the Horse) Barnes in the backfield with Jack Brown at quarterback.

Brown and Lance Locke made the passing attack work the best it has this season last week when they completed three for touchdowns to Gordy Carrigan.

Carrigan and his wing partner, Jim McAbee can give 46 reasons the passes of Brown and Locke have been successful.

Carrigan has caught 27 passes for 424 yards and McAbee has gathered in 19 for 196 yards.

Eastern Washington, on the other hand, has been having trouble getting in the scoring column. The Savages have tallied only 9.7 points per game while opponents have scored 22.1.

EWC's lone win in seven starts came over Western Washington 16-14. On one occasion they have tied that was in the EWC homecoming game as they played College of Puget Sound to a 13-13 standoff.

College of Idaho, Pacific Lutheran, Central Washington, and Whitworth all have registered wins over the luckless Savages.

Even Puget Sound has a win over them but it was on September 26 in the first game of the season. This game was a 27-6 loss for EWC in Tacoma while the tie was in

Mike McCauley will start at quarterback. Jerry McLain and Lanny Willman will start at halfbacks and Dave Davis will open at fullback.

The Hornets of Hedrick and the Bulldogs of McLoughlin reportedly are buzzing and barking, respectively, for action. Said Barney Riggs, head coach at Hedrick, "The kids are real eager and are showing a lot of desire for the game." And Ralph Perkins, head mentor at McLoughlin, stated, "The spirit at Mac has been quite high for this game."

Riggs said that Jerry Strat-

ton, the Hornets' jack of all backfield trades, will miss the game because of a chipped ankle bone and that Roy Shaw, an end may see but little service because of a leg ailment. With Stratton out of action, Darryl Stockton, regular center on offense, has been placed at the defensive safety post.

Perkins reported that the Bulldogs have spent much time on defense, aiming to stop the hard running Hornet fullback, Jim Bandy. He said that, if the Mac defensive unit performs up to its usual capacity, the tussle should be a close one. McLoughlin has permitted just two touchdowns.

High halfbacks Jack Lowery and Keith Dalbec are on the Bulldog ailing list. Lowery has a badly bruised elbow and Dalbec an injured thumb. Both may see some action but neither is listed as a starter. Perkins will have Frank Van Pelt mover to half and Mike Watkins play at fullback.
