Ashland pointer. Gray went 24 yards on a pitch to gain the goal. A bad center snap prevented a conversion kick. Dave Jackson sneaked the last yard of a 45-yard drive for the second Ashland TD. LeRoy Hannon's bonus kick try was partially blocked. Ashland gained no first downs in the first half.

Central Point - Crater high school's Comets, with Loyal Higginbotham crossing for all their touchdowns, turned back Ashland 20 to 12 here Friday night in a Southern Oregon conference tussle which dropped the curtain on the fall football campaign for both schools.

With the win the Comets evened for a non-lop loss to the Grizzlies, wound up tied for second in the conference and ended 1959 contention with a break-even 4-4 record. Ashland finished with a 5-4 winning season but with the Friday defeat ended 1-3 in the circuit and tied in the cellar with Klamath Falls. Crater shares second with Grants Pass.

Along with the scoring edge the Comets led 7 to 6 in first downs and 157 to 70 in punt and pick off return yards. Ashland headed in net scrimmage yards 141 to 125. Comet TDs came two in the second period and one in the third and Ashland found pay soil in the third and fourth quarters.

60 Yard Drive
First Comet marker, on a four-yard run by Higginbotham, climaxed a 60-yard push. It took nine plays with Higginbotham going 18 yards on one. But for the bonus failed.

A 49-yard punt by Gary Johnson and an Ashland muff on the play next gave Crater the ball on the Ashland one-yard line. Higginbotham went across from there and Johnson packed over the extra point.

Big spectacular of the night was the kick-off opening the second half. Johnson took the ball on the Crater 10 and, with good blocking to start him out, rambled 88 yards to Ashland two. Steve Gray caught him there after once being faked. But the TD still took a bit of doing. After no gain on a play, Crater was penalized to the seven. Higginbotham got back to the one. Ashland was charged a half-yard on an infraction and the score came on the next play. Eldred carried for the conversion.

A pass interception and run-back by George Moses from the Ashland 30 to the Crater 27 paved the way for the first

Rams Face Forty-Niners

The San Francisco Forty-Niners and the New York Giants, pinning their National Football league title hopes on stout defenses, must shackle razzle-dazzle offenses Sunday to protect their one-game division leads.

San Francisco, leading the Western division with a team that allowed its first six opponents to average only nine points, tackles the Rams at Los Angeles. The game is rated a tossup although the Forty-Niners (5-1) handed the offense-conscious Rams their first shutout since 1949 last month, 34-0.

The Rams have a 2-4 record but top the league's 12 teams in total offense with 2,159 yards. They are always tough at home and the Forty-Niners, nursing a one-game lead over the champion Baltimore Colts, have won only once in nine previous tries at Los Angeles.

New York, leading the Cleveland Browns and Philadelphia Eagles (each 4-2) by a game in the East, entertains the Chicago Cardinals and is a seven-point favorite. The Cardinals (2-4) cannot match the experience or defense power of the Giants (5-1) but have
