Requested books may be ordered from the Medford library, Mrs. Cook said. She said she also would appreciate information regarding the types of books visitors would prefer.

A fresh supply of reading material is assured with the monthly exchange of approximately 70 books with the Medford library. Current magazines also are on hand.

The Central Point library is open Mondays from 1 to 5 p.m. and Friday from 1 to 5 p.m. Tuesdays the library is open from 7 to 9 p.m. A drop-in slot affords convenience in returning books at any time.

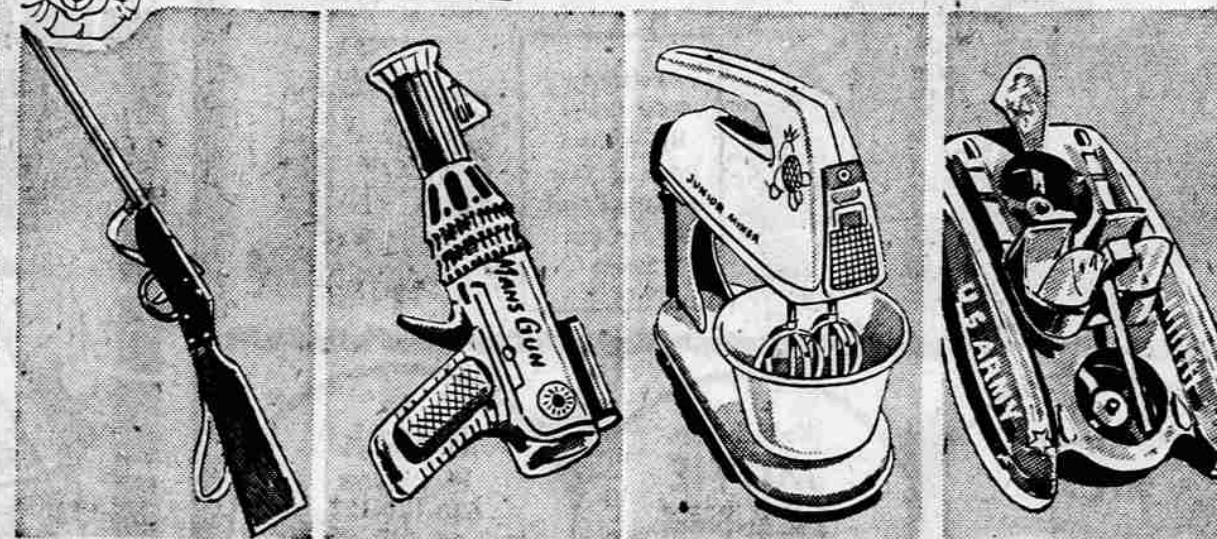
