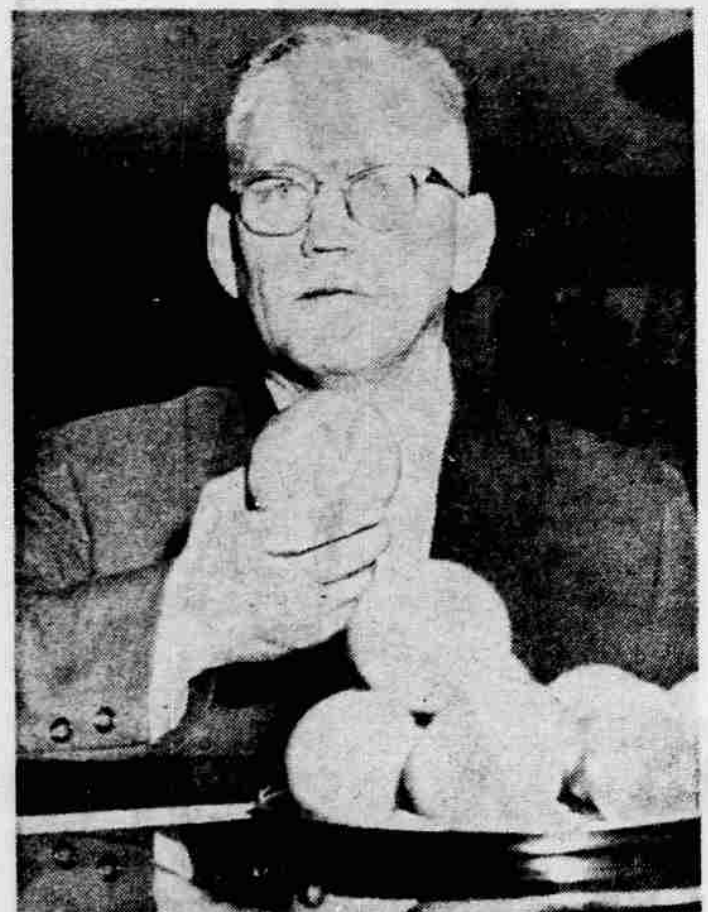


Syracuse Replaces LSU Team In UPI Football Ratings

LSU Grid Coach Claims Infractions

Baton Rouge, La. —UPI—Louisiana State football coach Paul Dietzel claimed Monday night that Tennessee scored its 14-13 upset on the Tigers last week on three rules infractions.

Speaking before a televised meeting of the Baton Rouge Quarterbacks Club, the LSU coach said, "We're not complaining, but I think it's a shame to lose one like that. I've already mentioned it to the man in charge of the officials."

The loss cost LSU its top national ranking and snapped the nation's longest current winning streak at 19.

Athletic officials at the University of Tennessee refused comment on any portion of Dietzel's charges.

Dietzel said Tennessee tailback Glenn Glass "was clearly in motion" when he took the snap on the Tiger 33 and passed 19 yards to Don Leske on the 14. He said a Volunteer lineman was offside on the same play.

On the next play, Dietzel said a blocking back "practically tackled" an LSU line-backer who was in line to stop Neyle Sollee who stepped

Indians Top Stats In Big Five

San Francisco —UPI— Although belted 55-13 last Saturday by UCLA, Stanford still picked up 214 yards passing and moved further ahead in "Big Five" statistics today with an average of 205.1 yards gained per game via the airline.

Southern California, which leads in five other major statistical brackets, bettered its average all around while downing West Virginia, 36-0. UCLA remained third in rushing despite Saturday's big splurge as both Southern California and Washington also improved their marks.

The Huskies registered three interceptions against Oregon State to boost their league-leading total to 21 in that division.

MAKES RECORD CATCH

West Palm Beach, Fla. —UPI— Local fishing club officials believe a 376-pound blue marlin landed by Alan Humphrey Jr. of Pittsburgh, Pa., may qualify as a new world record.

Humphrey's catch accomplished with light sailfish tackle and 20-pound test line, meets all requirements of the International Game Fish association, officials said. The old record for the 20-pound line classification was a 165-pounder caught in 1950.

New York —UPI— Syracuse, first Eastern team other than Army ever to top United Press International's major college football ratings, replaced Louisiana State in first place today but led Texas by only nine points.

Syracuse edged Penn State last Saturday, 20-18, in a clash of perfect record teams. This triumph, coupled with Louisiana State's surprise loss to Tennessee and Wisconsin's upset of Northwestern, enabled Syracuse to make its first appearance in the No. 1 spot since the ratings were inaugurated in 1950. Syracuse was third last week behind LSU and Northwestern.

Texas a one-point victor over Baylor, advanced from fourth to second and Southern California, easy winner over West Virginia, moved from fifth to third in the latest balloting by the 35 leading coaches who rate the teams for UPI. Syracuse and Southern California both 7-0 and Texas 8-0 are the only perfect-record teams in the top 10.

LSU slipped to fourth after leading the ratings the last four weeks of the 1958 season and the first seven of the current campaign. Wisconsin advanced from eighth to fifth and Northwestern dropped from second to sixth. Mississippi was seventh, Auburn eighth, Penn State ninth and Tennessee 10th.

Tennessee, which snapped Louisiana State's 19-game winning streak after smashing Auburn's 24-game unbeaten string earlier in the season, was the only newcomer in the top 10. Tennessee replaced Washington.

Clemson, Georgia, Washington, Georgia Tech, Oregon, Iowa, Michigan State, Arkansas, Texas Christian and North Texas State rounded out the first 20 in that order. No other teams received votes this week.

French Horses In Turf Tussle

Laurel, Mo. —UPI—Midnight Sun and Mi Carina, a pair of classy "grass cutters" from France, today were given the best chance of upsetting favored Tudor Era Wednesday in the \$100,000 Washington D.C. International at Laurel.

Tudor Era, one of the two American representatives in the 12-horse field, remained the 8-5 favorite for the mile and one-half classic over Laurel's turf course. However, both French horses were attracting strong support, too.

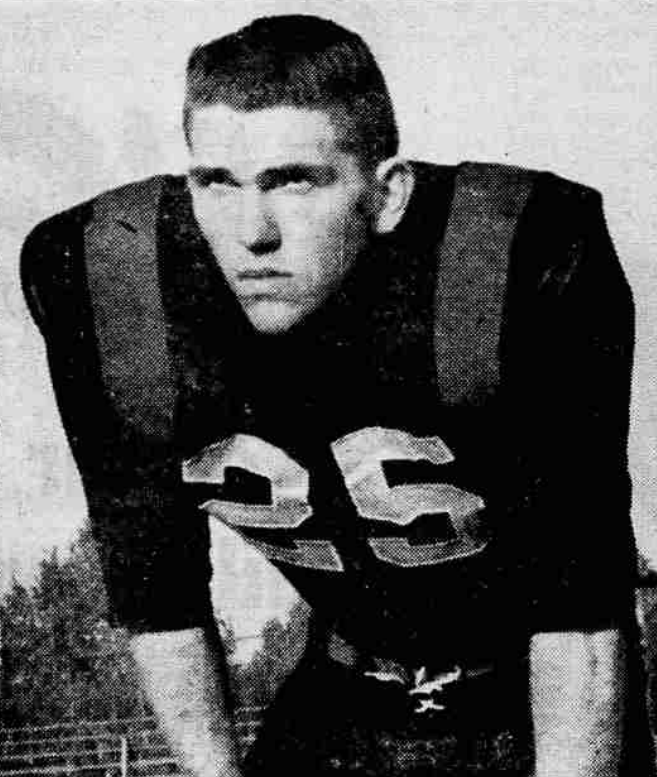
Midnight Sun was the second choice at 3-1 and Mi Carina, the filly from Chantilly, was 4-1 in the pre-race odds.

Bald Eagle, the other U.S. entry, and Venezuela's Pennsylvania were 8-1, the Russian entry of Garnir and Flang and England's Aggressor were bracketed at 15-1, and Mexico's Lea-B. New Zealand's Up and Coming, Australia's Vogel and Peru's Lightning were the 20-1 outsiders.

Dick Ragsdale, who has been undefeated Tornado's offensive general much of the time, heads the Pear city aggregation in passing, followed by Hood, Calvin Dean and Ray Konopasek. Lowell Dean, Jerry Anderson, Hood and Ragsdale have been the major pass receivers.

Bennett has crossed the goal line 12 times for Medford and Sieg and Hood on 10 occasions each. Sieg in rushing has run up a bulging 772 yards on 70 carries with the ball. Hood

Houston, Tex. —UPI— Enos Country Slaughter, one of baseball's "old pros," will manage and play for the Houston Buffs of the American association next season.

Marty Marion, president of the Buffs and a former teammate of Slaughter with the St. Louis Cardinals, made the announcement at a press conference Monday night. Slaughter has played in five World series, with the Cardinals in 1942 and 1946, and three times after he joined the New York Yankees in 1954.

The Yanks sold Slaughter to the Milwaukee Braves near the end of the 1959 season.

Slaughter, an outfielder, is a constant hustler. He has a lifetime batting average of .300 in the major leagues.
