Watch Kept Over Burned Out Tanker

Houston, Tex.—(UPI)—Firemen today maintained a "death watch" over boiling oil in the burned out tanker Amoco Virginia which was racked by explosions and fire that killed eight men.

Firemen said the 20,000 ton vessel was still so hot that several thousand barrels of unburned oil and gasoline in the ship were "boiling like grease in a hot frying pan."

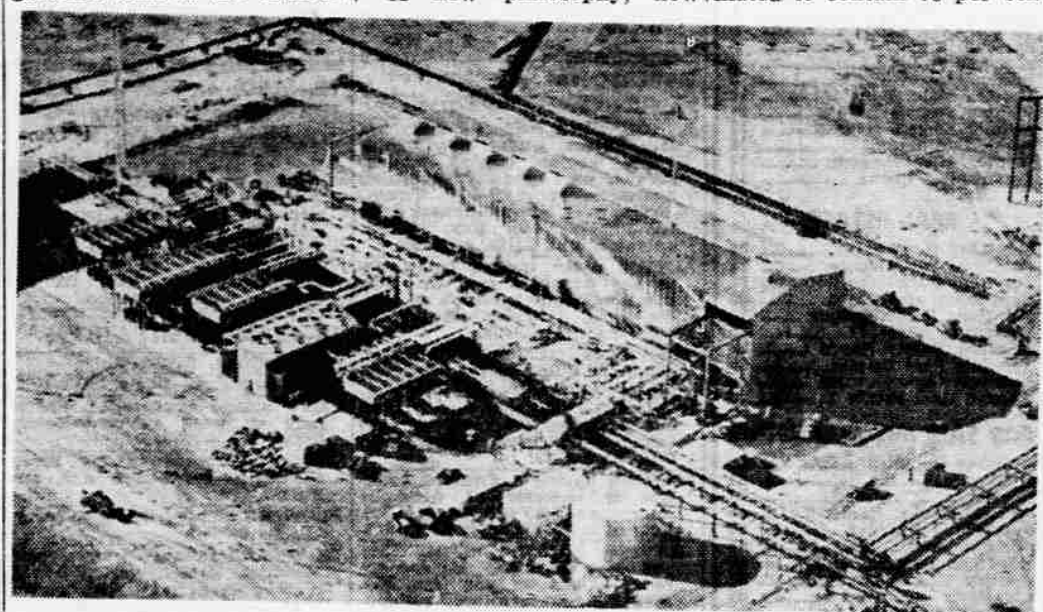
The death watch will be maintained until the ship cools off to the point where there will no longer be danger of new flames that could touch off billions of gallons of gasoline in tanks on shore. If those tanks explode, disaster would spread over an area where 50,000 to 60,000 persons live.

Arabs Believed Preparing Demand To Share in Oil Profits

Beirut — (UPI) — Informed sources here believe the Arab states are preparing to demand 50 per cent of all profits to be made anywhere in the world from mid-eastern oil — from the well head to the gasoline tank of the ultimate consumer.

Present contracts provide for sharing equally the value of oil at the well heads. These currently are estimated to yield the Arab states \$1 billion annually, according to R. G. Folis, chairman of the board of Standard of California.

A new philosophy, however, is evidence in reports from a meeting of Arab League oil experts in Saudi Arabia now under examination here. These indicate a new policy of "creeping nationalism" in regard to the Middle East's vast oil reserves.

These resources are estimated to contain 70 per cent

of the known global reserves. Sheikh Abdullah Tariki of Saudi Arabia has emerged as the leader of a youngish, so-called group of "oil technocrats" of the Arab governments.

Tariki was quoted at the conference as envisaging the day when Arabs will control all aspects of oil production and transportation, and have at least a 50 per cent share in markets to which Arab oil

goes. The "technocrats" are only too well aware of the results of Iranian Premier Mohammed Mossadegh's precipitate action in 1951 in nationalizing Persian oil wells. They therefore do not advocate Mossadegh's brand of nationalization "by the stroke of a pen."

But they state the belief that a complete takeover can be achieved on a gradual basis.

Oil companies assert that their contract rights are being encroached upon at very turn in the Middle East with the possible exception of Kuwait.

USS Triton Joins Submarine Fleet

Groton, Conn. — (UPI) — The twin-reactor USS Triton, the Navy's mobile "private eye" to guard against a sneak attack, joined the U.S. Atlantic submarine fleet today.

The 447-foot, 5,900 ton nuclear radar-picket sub, costing \$110 million, hoisted its commissioning pennant as it was turned over to the Navy at a dockside ceremony at the yards of the Electric Boat division of General Dynamics Corp., which built it.

Accepting the biggest submarine ever built was Capt. George L. Lathrup, commanding officer of the U.S. naval base at nearby New London.

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
