The Medical Roundup

Today many surgeons and many women feel that a complete hysterectomy is a harmless operation with a very low mortality. Many a woman wants her pelvic organs removed because she is a bunch of nerves, or she has sick headaches, or she is tired of worrying about getting pregnant. What bothers me about all this is that a complete hysterectomy, with loss of the ovaries as well as the womb, is not always a harmless operation with a happy end result.

Every week in my mail, I get letters like the following: A woman of 47 writes that two years ago, simply because she had a small, harmless and silent nodule of muscle on her womb—a so-called fibroid—which was not causing her to bleed excessively and was not causing any symptoms that anyone could see, she cheerfully consented to have a hysterectomy. Probably the surgeon had a fear that some day the nodule of muscle might turn into a sarcoma which is a malignant tumor. Actually, I cannot remember when, in my long experience as a physician, I ever saw this happen, and today many teachers of gynecology are advising their students not to worry about this very slight possibility.

Here is what has now happened to my correspondent. She says, "Why has my husband lost his sexual interest in me? I am still affectionate and responsive. Actually, I now tease him and tell him he acts exactly as if he had had the operation instead of me. He claims he still loves me very much, but no longer will be come to my bed. What is wrong? Am I repulsive to him in some way? Does he think in some way now I am not healthy enough for loving? Does he now look on me more as a sick woman than as his former loved wife? I wish so much that I knew what has gone wrong. Definite information on the subject would be easier on me than this constant uncertainty and puzzlement." Many other women of 30 or 40 write me each month to say that after a complete hysterectomy they lost whatever sexual interest they had, and, as a result, their marriage is now breaking up. Others write me that all their married life they had longed for a child, but had lived on hope. When, with a hysterectomy, this hope was taken from them, they went to pieces nervously. One such woman promptly left her fine husband. Whenever she saw a pregnant woman anywhere, she got to weeping hysterically. I have letters from dozens of women who wrote recently to tell me that, after a hysterectomy, they went into a depression in which they suffered terribly, and lost all interest in husband, children and home.

Only a Percentage Obviously, such disasters come to only a percentage of the women who submit to a complete hysterectomy. Obviously also, there are thousands of hysterectomies that are much needed to stop severe and repeated flooding. What many teachers of gynecology now are protesting against is the performance of hysterectomies that are not needed at the time, and which perhaps could easily be put off until, with the menopause, the uterus will shrink a good deal. Then the operation may never be needed. What I object to greatly is the tendency of some surgeons to perform hysterectomy on a woman who is slipping into a depression. The operation then is very likely to push her into a mental hospital. Usually, in these cases, the woman welcomes the operation because she is frantic to get well and to get well quickly, and she thinks the operation will cure her. Actually, it practically always makes her worse.

Nixon Thanks Neuberger for 'Graciousness'

Portland—(UPI)—Vice President Richard Nixon has thanked Sen. and Mrs. Richard L. Neuberger for their "graciousness" during an episode which occurred at the time The Dalles dam was being dedicated last month. Neuberger had been assigned to take part in the ceremony as a representative of the Senate Interior committee. But neither the senator nor his wife had seats at the table for speakers at the luncheon in The Dalles junior high school. The Neuberger family ate sandwiches with state and local police in the school basement and Neuberger gave up his time on the luncheon speaking program to Nixon. "You and Maurine are both known for your graciousness. However, you may be sure I would never have agreed to come to The Dalles dam dedication ceremonies if I had known in advance that the quality of yours would be taxed to the point where you would be called upon to relinquish, even momentarily, your seat on the platform, as well as your time on the program."

Rail Traffic Figures Decline

Salem—(UPI)—Freight and passenger traffic handled by railroads in Oregon during 1958 continued to decline, figures released by the Public Utility commission indicated Tuesday.

Revenue passengers carried were down 6.27 per cent as compared with 1957.

Freight movements dropped 5.07 per cent.

For the nation as a whole, according to Interstate Commerce commission figures, revenue passengers and freight moved dropped 13.51 and 14.11 per cent, respectively, for the same period.

Mail and express operating revenues, for Oregon, however, showed a healthy 11.52 per cent increase—due in part to rate hikes.

Less than carload traffic increased 11.42 per cent while carload freight dropped 5.11 per cent during the year.

Total Oregon operating revenues were down 2.97 per cent, compared to 8.97 per cent as shown by ICC figures for the nation's railroads.
