Cranberry Growers Declared Caught in Jurisdictional Tiff

New York — (UPI) — The chief spokesman for the cranberry industry has outlined the history of the controversy over possible contamination of some of the cranberry crop.

Ambrose E. Stevens, executive vice president and general manager of Ocean Spray Cranberries, Inc., a cooperative representing about 75 per cent of the nation's growers, said they had been caught in a jurisdictional dispute between the Department of Agriculture and the Food and Drug administration.

Some Jump Gun
1957—Some growers jumped the gun, using aminotriazole as a weed killer in cranberry bogs before it was approved by the Department of Agriculture and under confused and inaccurate directions. About three million tons of cranberries were impounded and have been destroyed.

1958—The weed killer was approved by the Department of Agriculture for use after the harvest and for similarly controlled use on corn and tobacco and a number of fruits. Stevens said there was no reason to suspect any improper use.

1959 — The makers of the weed killer, American Cyanide Co., applied to the Food and Drug administration for a determination of tolerance—a measure of how much aminotriazole residue on food could be considered nonharmful to humans.

Cancer in Rats
In May, the Food and Drug administration reported that the weed killer, in amounts of 10 parts per million, had been found to cause thyroid cancer in rats and refused a tolerance rating—in effect stating that no amount of the compound could be considered safe in food.

On Sept. 18, the organization ordered all growers to stop all use of the weed killer because of the conflict between the two government agencies as to its safety.

The Ocean Spray organization demanded sworn affidavits of all growers that they had used the weed killer only after harvest, the prescribed method which is presumed to leave no residue on berries. Of 1,079 growers only 10 or 11 refused to sign affidavits. Their crops and some others, which the organization had reason to suspect might have been contaminated by drift from adjoining fields or roadsides—where the chemical is used to kill weeds and poison ivy—were impounded.

Still Coming In
Stevens estimated the amount of the crop impounded would be about the same as in 1957; the crop is still coming in.

He said the organization had purchased a \$10,000 spectrometer and was testing suspected cranberries with methods identical to those of the Food and Drug administration.

He said that it is probable tests will be made on the 1958—crop of canned goods, although they are not at present suspected so far as he is concerned.

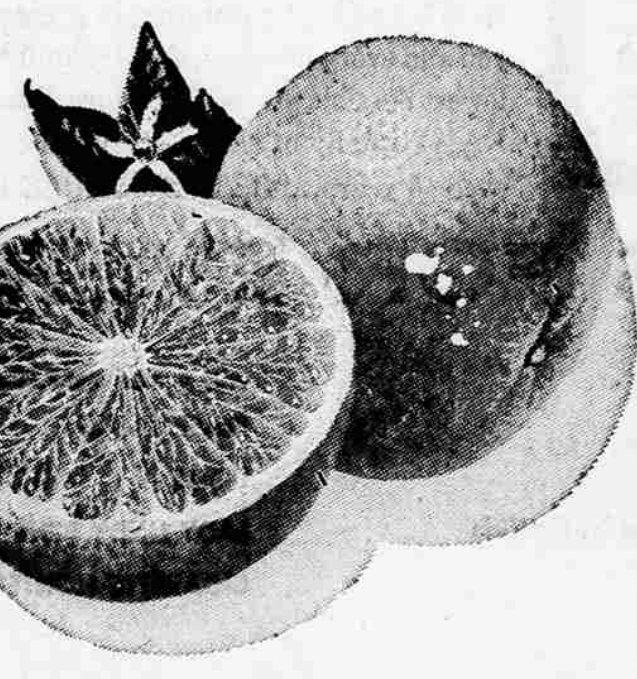

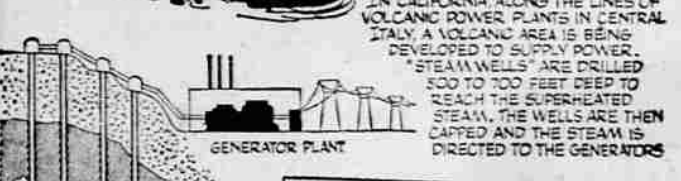
