Dry Christmas Party Urged on Employers

Chicago — Employers were urged today to dry up the Christmas office party.

The request came from the National Safety Council, which blames the flowing bowl at the office party for getting the Christmas traffic toll off to a dizzy, dangerous start.

"Our surveys," said the Council, "show that a sizeable percentage of Christmas traffic accidents occur in the early hours of the holiday period. Many of these can be traced back to the office party and its highball hilarity."

To Eliminate Accidents
The Council emphasized it is not trying to dampen the traditional Christmas spirit.

"Just the opposite," it asserted. "We are trying to eliminate a definite source of highway accidents — accidents which can completely ruin Christmas for anyone they touch."

"You just can't have a merry Christmas if someone you love is hurt or killed."

The Council is asking its \$,000 business and industrial member concerns to take a new look at their office parties and either keep the cork in the bottle or eliminate the parties.

It also is enlisting the support of churches of every faith and creed in a united effort to keep the threat of drinking drivers to a minimum over the Christmas holiday season.

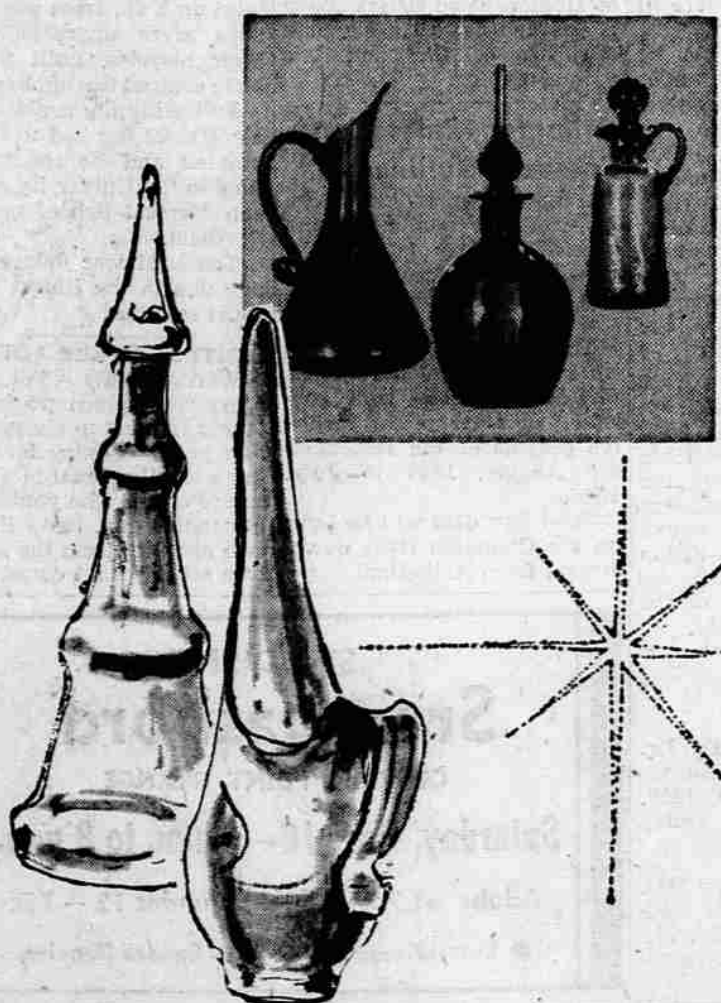

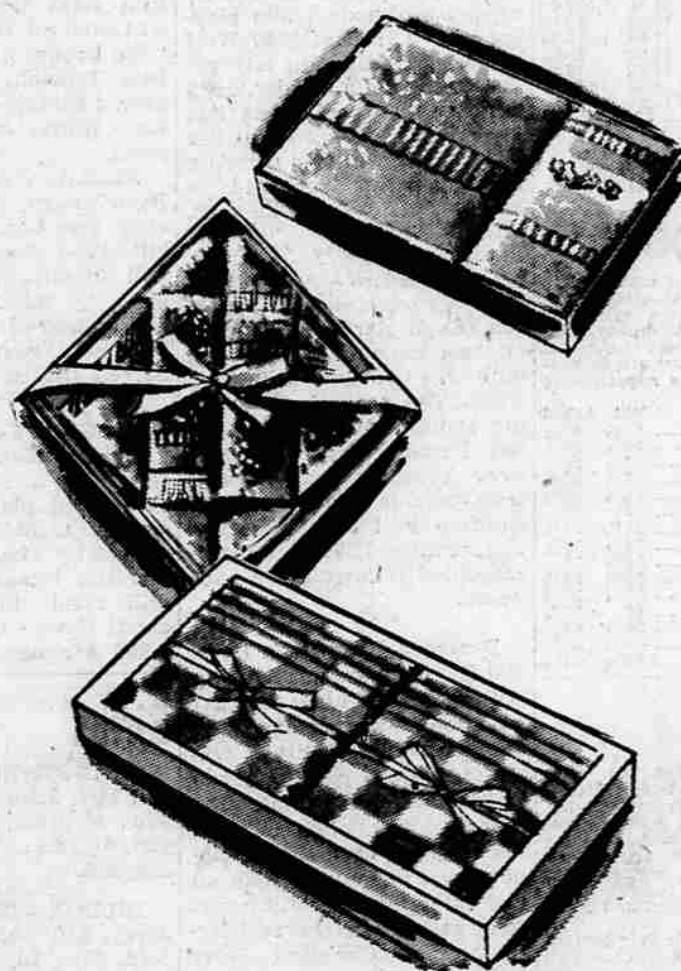
