Wives and widows of all Elk members are invited. Reservations should be made by calling Mrs. Alva Perkins, Spring 2-8633.

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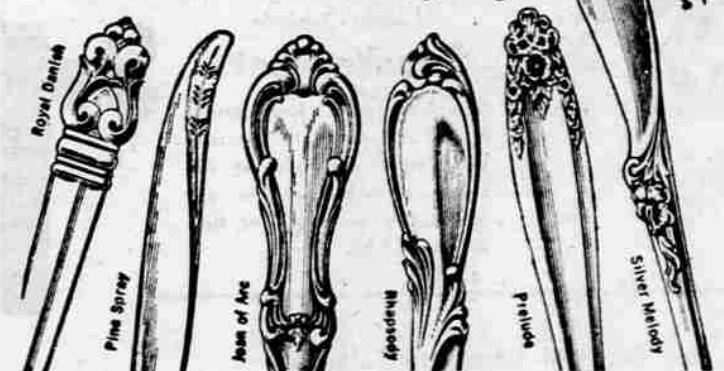
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
