

'Atoms at Work' Mobile Exhibit To Visit City

"Atoms at Work," a large walk-through mobile exhibit operated by the museum division of the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, will be in Medford Nov. 19 and 20 under the sponsorship of the Medford Junior Chamber of Commerce, Hal Gardner, chairman, has announced.

The free public exhibit is part of the public education program of the Atomic Energy Commission within their "Atoms for Peace" program. The exhibit, housed in a 35-foot van, provides nuclear science information of interest to residents, and an opportunity to learn many of the peacetime applications of atomic energy in medicine, agriculture, industry, research and power, Gardner said.

To Inform Public
The AEC's exhibit is to inform the American public of the peace-time application of atomic energy, and to encourage students to pursue scientific degrees.

The exhibit will be at Medford High school all day Thursday, Nov. 19, and at McLoughlin Junior High the morning of Nov. 20. It will move to Hedrick Junior High that afternoon. Friday evening it will be at the Medford Shopping Center, Gardner said.

Doran A. Tabolosky, manager of the exhibit, will speak at the California Oregon Power company's Quarter Century club Thursday noon at the Medford hotel, and that evening he will speak before the Medford subsection of the American Institute of Electrical Engineers.

Marine Officer to Be in Medford

A Marine cadet selection officer will be in Medford Tuesday, Nov. 17, to interview young men interested in the Marine Corps aviation program, Capt. W. P. Gorski, officer in charge of Marine recruiting in Oregon has announced.

Candidates under the Marcad program are sent directly to the Naval Air station, Pensacola, Fla., where they receive about 18 months of advanced flight training, Captain Gorski said.

Applicants are asked to call the Marine recruiting station or the Marine reserve training center in this area for an appointment with the Marcad selection officer.

Medford Building Permits Increase

The value of building permits in Medford in September showed an increase over September, last year, but a decline from August this year, according to the University of Oregon's bureau of business research.

The total of September, 1959, building permits here was \$262,953, compared to \$261,953 last September, and \$328,535 in August, 1959.

New residential construction here was valued at \$192,600, the bureau reported, with \$44,473 for new non-residential, and \$25,880 for additions, alterations and repairs to existing structures.

Bids for Home Are Rejected in Yreka

Yreka—Bids for construction of the first unit of the Siskiyou county detention home have been rejected and will be re-submitted, according to county officials.

The structure will be built adjacent to the county hospital here. Lowest of three bids was for \$63,337 from Cummings Construction company, Grants Pass.

Other bidders were Kenicott Construction company, Redding, Calif., \$66,448, and Earl R. Cummings, Yreka, \$71,368.

Plans call for a single-story building covering about 4,000 square feet. It will include administrative wing, dormitory space for dependent boys and girls, a large dining and activity area and a small operator's apartment.

Cooking facilities are to be included, but for the present most cooking will be done in the hospital.

Davis replied, "It's a classical language."



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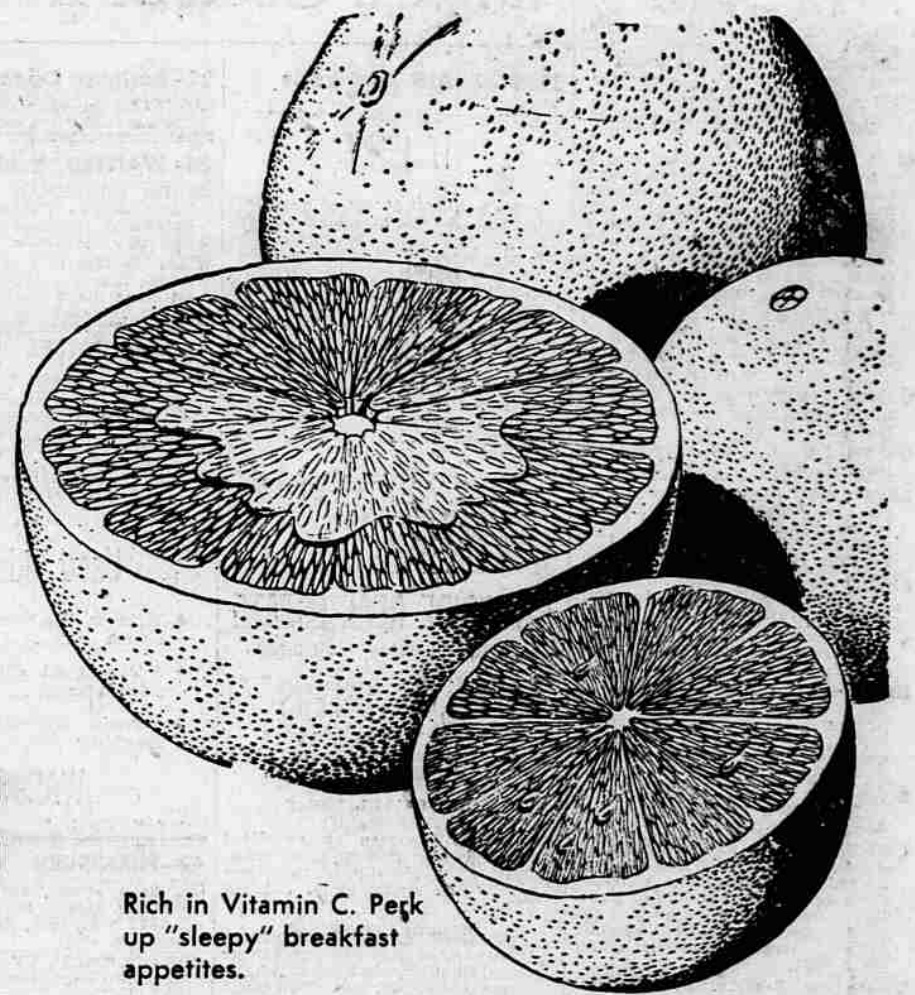
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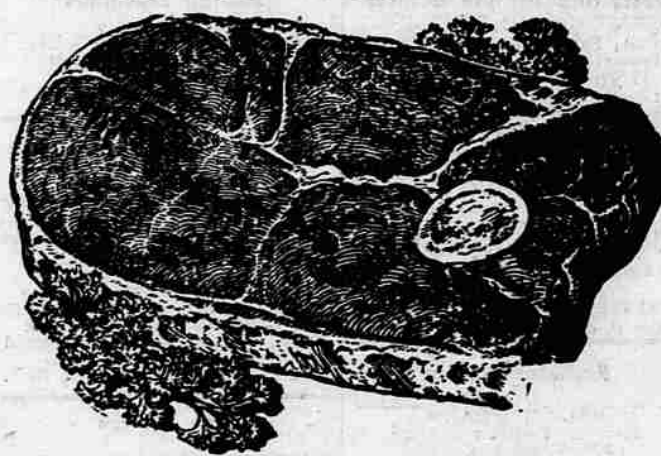
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
