The Medical Roundup

Diagnosis of Multiple Sclerosis

I recently received an interesting letter from a housewife who writes that, for four years she staggered around, suffering all ways from feelings of great fatigue and weakness in her legs. Sometimes she saw double, or one eye would not see well; sometimes she had a feeling of numbness somewhere, and sometimes a muscle in her leg or arm would get very weak. My correspondent says that time and again, during the years, she went to a doctor who, without waiting to hear all of her story, said, "Oh, you're just a bunch of nerves; get a rest, and take this bromide or this tranquilizer and you'll be all right." She says that once she was sent to a psychiatrist to see if he could "put some sense and backbone" into her. Always she maintained that there must be something physically wrong with her, and Oh, how justified she felt when, one day, her husband took her to a big city and to a good neurologist who, within a few minutes, said, "You have the typical multiple symptoms and signs of multiple sclerosis."

I must quickly warn thousands of unhappy, tired and nervous housewives that they mustn't all now rush to a neurologist, demanding that he make a diagnosis of multiple sclerosis, because nervousness and neuroses and fatigue are extremely common, and multiple sclerosis, thank God, is fairly rare. The only reason I mention this woman's letter — and I could mention many more like it that come to my desk — is that in many cases we doctors should not jump to the conclusion that the patient before us has "just nerves." Often, if we'd only take the time to get an adequate history, we would learn that the patient has certain symptoms, such as double vision, which one just must not try to laugh off. Double vision, or patches of numbness, or definite weakness in one or two muscles, or an inability always to control the emptying of the bladder are not symptoms of nervousness; they are symptoms of something definitely wrong with the nervous system. In all such cases, I immediately ask a trained neurologist to take over.

Night Terrors in a Child
A number of mothers have written asking what to do for a child who has night terrors, and frequently wakes the family with his screams. If there is any serious nervous or mental convulsive disease in the family, the physician in charge might do well to have an electroencephalogram made to see if the boy has any actual abnormality in the electrical waves of his brain. In that case, an anti-convulsive drug might help. In many cases, the child says that he'd be all right if, at night, his parents would only leave a little light in his room. I think he is right. I know that when I was a small child, I sometimes had what were called night terrors, but what happened was that I waked and thought that I heard someone moving in the completely dark room. Because I couldn't see, I became terrified. If only a small light, such as today can be put into a base plug outlet, had been left in the room, I'm sure I would have had no trouble. I think it is very cruel to compel a sensitive and fearful child to sleep in a completely dark room, when he begs to have a little light left, or when he begs permission to leave his door open so that a little light can come in from the hall. Parents will say, "But I don't want to give in to him; I don't want him to grow up a coward." I certainly wouldn't worry about that. Later, when he grows older he may no longer be afraid of sleeping in the dark. And yet, there are many people who, all their lives, cannot sleep comfortably in the dark. That is why, in every bedroom in our Pullman cars, there is a faint night light, just strong enough to enable a person, when he wakes, to see that there is no one in the room.

Noises in the Head

I get several letters a day from people who want to know what to do about buzzing or whistling noises in their head. Usually, all I can say is, "Go to a good ear man and find out if there is any disease in your ears. If there is

absolutely none, and you are past 50 years of age, the noises are probably due to disease in a tiny artery in your brain. Perhaps you can remember that the noises followed a bad dizzy or woozy spell which made you wonder if you were having a "little stroke." Actually, it does not make much difference where the noises are being produced, because I don't know of any medicine that will surely help the situation. Usually, the sufferer can only hope that either the noise quits, or he gets used to it. Doctors usually try taking away the patient's table salt, and often they give nicotinic acid, but in many a case, these measures do not help.
