

### Cab Driver Kills Self After Murder

Boston —UPI— A cab driver who police said killed his former girl friend and the prosperous contractor who was escorting her committed suicide today.

The suspect, Edward Tumulty, 32, died at Cambridge City hospital more than two hours after he was found unconscious on the lawn of Cambridge Public library with a bullet wound in the head.

Tumulty shot himself about two miles from where police said he ambushed Barbara Betts, 30, and Louis Vuona, 40, executive of a Worcester, Mass., salvage firm, Wednesday night and pumped seven bullets into them.

Police said the woman, who died early today, had named Tumulty as her assailant. He stopped from an alley and shot down the couple as they approached their car after dining at a hotel. Vuona, who died instantly, was shot four times and Miss Betts three times.

After the slayings, police said, Tumulty apparently wandered the streets in his car and on foot for nearly 12 hours.

The car was found about a third of a mile from the library where Tumulty shot himself.

A gun was in his hand and a bullet had entered behind his right ear and emerged from the top of his head.

Police called the case "murder and suicide."

### Rocky Proposes Pan-Am Union

New York —UPI— Governor Nelson A. Rockefeller proposed Wednesday night that the United States, Canada and the Latin American nations get together in a Pan American economic union comparable to the recently-formed European Economic Community.

The governor outlined his plan at the National Foreign Trade council's World Trade dinner.

He said the purpose of such an economic union would be to raise living conditions in the Western hemisphere and meet competition from other regional economic blocs.

"I can think of nothing that would do more in the long run to promote human well-being, personal dignity and understanding in the hemisphere," Rockefeller said.

He said one result of such a plan would be "to help alleviate the unrest, the trouble and the unhappiness in Latin America." He expressed "deep concern" over anti-American outbreaks in Cuba and Panama.

The proposed union, he said, would permit the Western hemisphere to bargain as a unit with other regional trade units, and would allow a freer flow of goods and manpower between the member nations.

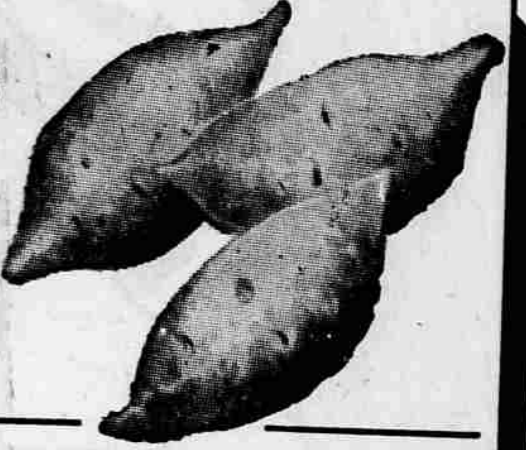
