

Trujillo Said Offering Reward For Ex-American

Havana, Cuba — (UPI) — Maj. William A. Morgan, an ex-American who now is a Cuban citizen, said today that Dominican strongman Rafael L. Trujillo is offering \$500,000 to anyone who "can kidnap me and deliver me alive in the Dominican Republic."

The 31-year-old ex-GI, formerly of Toledo, Ohio, made the charge during an interview in his secluded penthouse apartment where well-armed Cuban army soldiers maintain a constant guard against any new attempt on his life.

He said Trujillo is anxious to get him—dead or alive—for his key role in luring a Dominican invasion force into a fatal trap at Trinidad, Las Villas province, in the southern central part of Cuba last August.

Two assassination attempts have been made against him here during the past two months.

"One man, caught in one of the attacks, said he had been offered \$45,000 to kill me," the ex-Yank said with a relaxed smile.

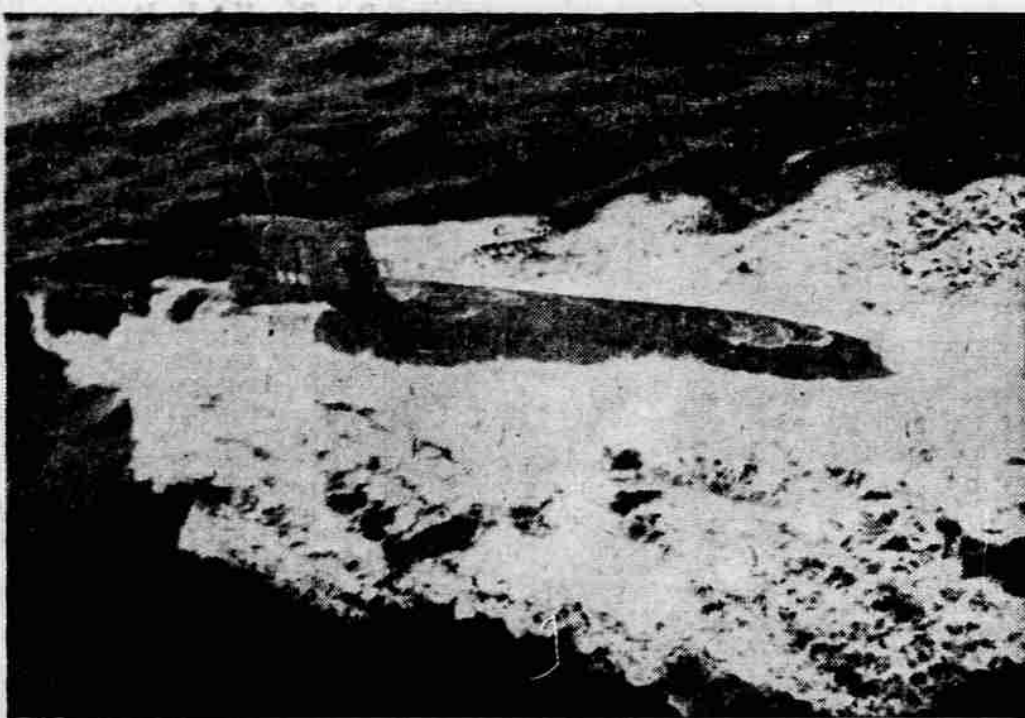
"But to anyone who can deliver me alive to the Dominican Republic, Trujillo will pay out a half a million dollars," he added. "That's a lot of dough and there are a lot of mercenaries willing to work for him."

Morgan became one of the top rebel guerrilla leaders in the successful revolt which ousted the Batista regime last Jan. 1 and brought Fidel Castro's 26th of July movement into power.

Mikoyan Winds Up North Mexico Tour

Monterrey, Mexico — (UPI) — Soviet Deputy Premier Anastas Mikoyan wound up a tour of industrial northern Mexico today and heads for the oil center of Ciudad Pemex on the south Gulf coast.

Mikoyan flew in Sunday night from Monclova, where he offered to sell "all kinds of industrial machinery" to the \$70 million Altos Hornos steel mill, Latin America's largest. He said Mexico could have 10 years to pay for Soviet purchases at 2 per cent interest.

Nehru Hints of More Army Training

New Delhi—(UPI) — Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru hinted Saturday that the government may begin a program of military training in Indian schools and colleges in light of recent threatening gestures from Communist China.

"A weak nation has no place in society today," Nehru said in a speech highlighting a territorial army parade. The Prime Minister emphasized that he was against conscription "as it is practiced in western countries." But he added that some kind of military training was necessary for India's young men of college and school age.

"It is necessary that the country should be prepared to meet all emergencies," Nehru said. He added that India did not intend to tolerate border aggressions.

Hunters Search for Panther in Missouri

Hamburg, Iowa—(UPI) — Search parties on foot and in airplanes Saturday hunted for a killer panther along the Missouri river. Two hunters reported seeing the large cat just south of the Iowa-Missouri border last Thursday. The partly-eaten carcass of a deer was found in the area. Hunters said the panther's tracks measured six inches in width.

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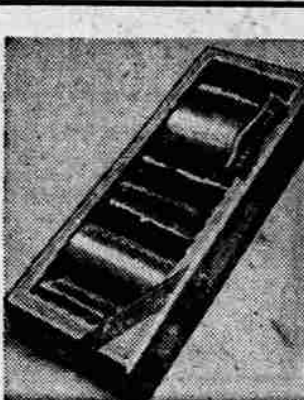
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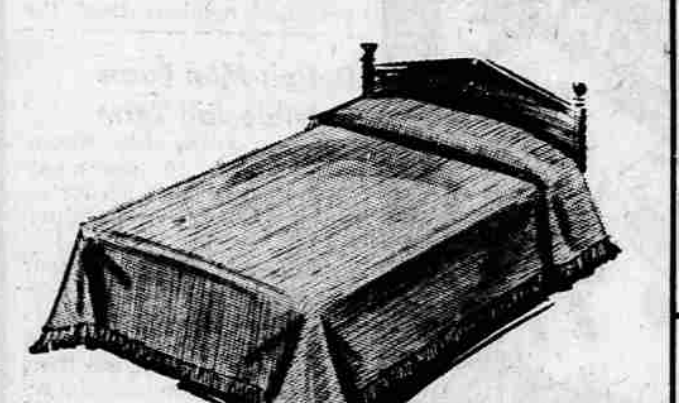


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
