## The Family Council

Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a Judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

**Martha J.**—If my parents don't stop hovering I'll move away.

**Mrs. E. J.**—She can't be on her own.

**Martha J.**—I am 24, the youngest of three children and the only one still single in the family. I live with my family in a comfortable apartment and I make a small contribution toward the expenses.

My problem is that my parents hover over me constantly. I like to spend a lot of my time alone in my room reading or watching TV. My mother and father drop in several times to talk or find out if I want anything. When I get a telephone call they always ask me who it was. I have told them that I'm going to move away and get a place of my own if they don't leave me on my own. They just don't seem to understand how much they annoy me.

**Mrs. E. J.**—All this talk of moving away and getting a place of her own is just nonsense. Martha can't move away from a beautiful home and all that we can give her. She doesn't make enough money to be on her own.

We certainly try to give her all the privacy possible. Is it so wrong of me to stop into her room and ask if she wants a glass of milk or a piece of fruit? She keeps too much to herself and doesn't go out enough. We don't want her to brood and feel lonesome.

Martha isn't an outgoing girl. If she lived alone she'd be miserable.

**The Council:** Most young men and women of Martha's age attain as much independence from their parents as

they really want. Most parents tend to baby their children a little longer than necessary if their children seem to ask for it emotionally.

Martha's annoyance with her parents is really misdirected. She is annoyed with herself for needing their love more than she should at this time. A woman of her age should be actively engaged in living and in creating a rich future for herself. She may need some time to herself, but if she feels she is living her own life in the full sense of the word, she is likely to gloss over the "hovering" she describes.

A young girl can live with her parents and be an independent, mature individual at the same time. Or she can move away from her parents and remain an infant emotionally. It all depends on her own attitude and what she does with her life in other spheres.

The E. J.'s show that they are very much worried about Martha and would like to do something to help her. Yet there is little they can do at this stage. The time has come when Martha alone can help herself.

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We think Martha should make the effort to come to terms with herself. She should recognize that she is failing to do whatever is necessary to create a fuller life for herself. Undoubtedly she needs more friends, an engrossment in her work or hobbies. By merely dreaming about the future or brooding about the present, she will attain nothing.

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## Guidance Clinic to Have Psychologist

Miss Charlotte David, Portland, will work as a clinical psychologist for the Southern Oregon Child Guidance clinic, a clinic spokesman has announced.

The clinic has been without a psychologist since Dr. Edward Scott, psychologist with a state board of health, was forced to discontinue his one-day-a-month visits to Klamath Falls and Medford in July due to a schedule conflict.

Miss David will continue the one-day visits when she will conduct tests evaluating their results later, it was explained. Dr. Harry Danielson, Medford psychiatrist, also works with the clinic, but on a personal interview basis.

## Bids To Be Called On 2 County Bridges

Among the some 18 projects on which the highway commission will open bids Dec. 8 are two Jackson county projects. One calls for the construction of a bridge over the East Fork Evans creek on Antioch rd., about 19 miles northwest of Medford, and another bridge over Bitter Lick creek on Elk creek rd., about 48 miles northeast of Medford. The Antioch rd. project calls for a 126-foot span with 24-foot roadway. The Bitter Lick creek bridge will include a 122-foot span with 26-foot roadway.

Salem (UPI)—Gov. Mark Hatfield has appointed Lloyd A. Griffiths of Salem as a member of the employee suggestion awards board.

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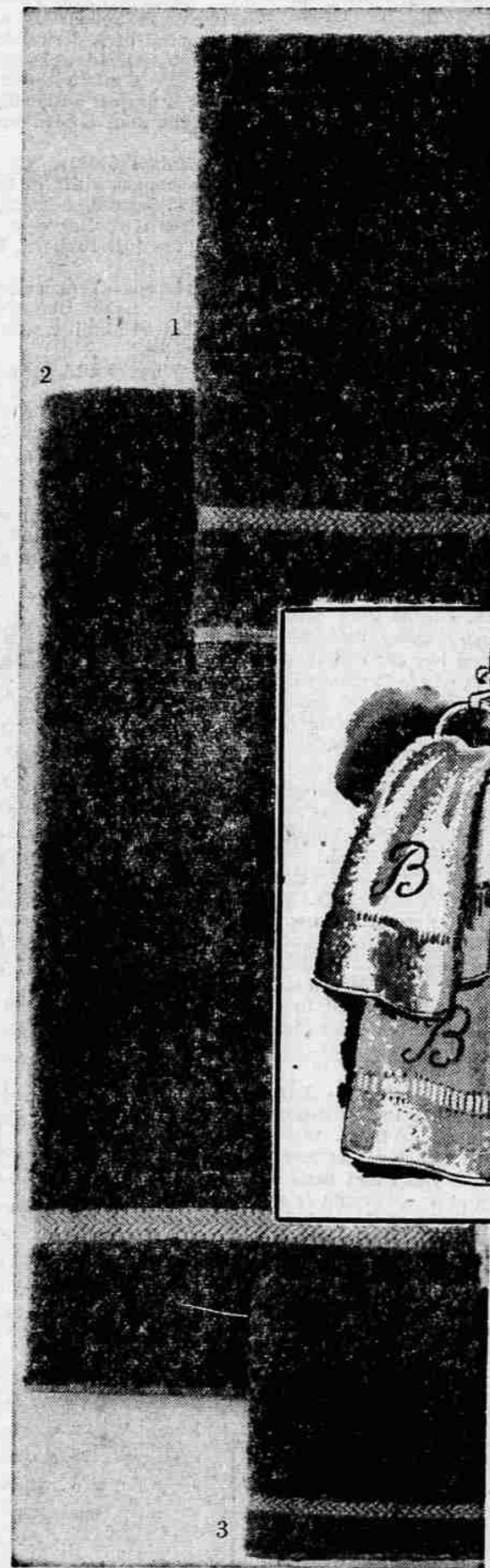
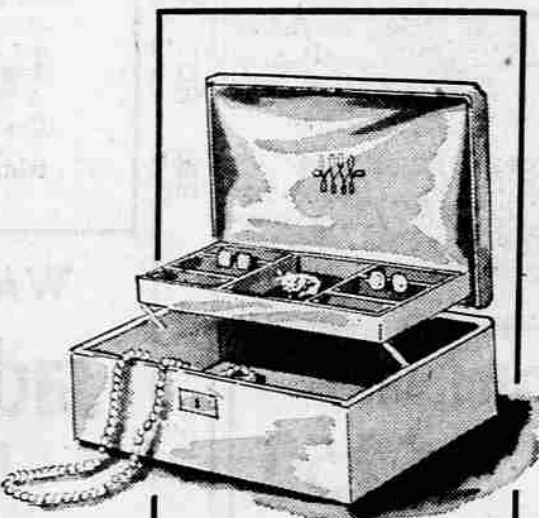
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
