

Lions Play Green Bay Thursday

The Baltimore Colts, Cleveland Browns, New York Giants and Pittsburgh Steelers are favored in Sunday's key National Football league games.

The Detroit Lions (2-6-1) and Green Bay Packers (4-5) open the 10th week of the 12-week campaign Thursday in their traditional Thanksgiving Day clash. The Lions are two-point choices for the Western Division game at Detroit.

Baltimore, tied with the San Francisco Forty-Niners (each 6-3) for the Western lead, is a 10-point choice to whip the visiting Los Angeles Rams. The Browns, trailing the first-place New York Giants by a game in the Eastern race, entertain the Forty-Niners in a clash which will affect both divisions.

Browns 10-Point Favorites

The Browns (6-3) are favored by 10 points. If the odds makers are right about these two games, the Colts will be alone in first place, a game ahead of the Forty-Niners, Sunday night.

New York (7-2) entertains the Washington Redskins (3-6) and is favored by nine points. Pittsburgh (4-4-1) upset New York and Cleveland in its last two starts and is a 3½ point pick to whip its third straight contender when it plays host to the Philadelphia Eagles (6-3). The Eagles and Browns are tied for second behind New York in the East.

Bears Over Cardinals

In Sunday's other game, the Chicago Bears (5-4) are seven-point favorites for their annual clash with the Chicago Cardinals (2-7). The Bears are only a game behind the two Western leaders and could tie for first place by winning, if the Forty-Niners and Colts lose.

The jamboree will consist of as many basketball games as participants turn out. They will be short, 20 to 30 minute games between teams that will be made up as individuals sign up.

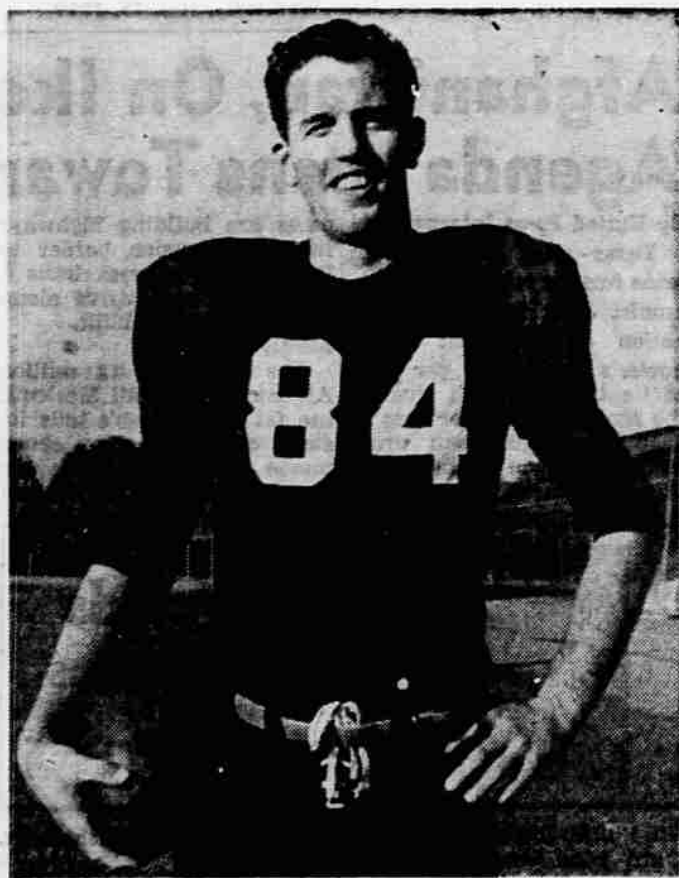

Revelle's Passing Eagles' Big Threat Against St. Mary's

"We'll certainly have our work cut out for us if he is going to throw."

Coach Bill McKibbin of the St. Mary's high football team was speaking of Ron Revelle of the Yoncalla Eagles. And, he was pointing up the reason why pass defense is an important matter in Crusader drills this week.

St. Mary's and Yoncalla vie on the gridiron Saturday night for the Oregon Class B championship. The titular encounter is set for 8 p.m. at the Medford High school stadium.

108 of 181 Complete
It's no wonder that the Crusaders have Revelle on their minds. For the Eagle passer so far this fall has

hurled 33 touchdown strikes and completed 21 conversion throws. So far this fall the air arm of the Eagles has pitched 181 passes and 108 have been caught.

Tickets for the St. Mary's-Yoncalla Class B high school championship football game here Saturday night are now on sale at six locations. They may be obtained at Lampport's Sporting Goods store, Acme Hardware store, Hal-K Appliance store, First National bank, United States National bank and St. Mary's school office. Seats are all general admission for the conflict and will be occupied on a first come basis.

Aerial operation of the Yoncallans is not all that St. Mary's defenders will be called upon to stop. As McKibbin mentioned, passing makes the Eagle running game more effective. And, there's good evidence of the strength of the Eagles' overall attack. They've piled up 524 points in 11 games this fall in a so far unbeaten march. There are good runners in Doug Holloman, Orlan Wiley and Cliff Emery. Yoncalla has what might be termed a double pronged offense.

Daley To Miss Game

Yoncalla, which apparently likes to go for the long gain, is riding on 11 straight victories this fall. In fact, the Eagles have lost just once in 22 games and that was to Merrill in the state championship game last fall. St. Mary's is 9-1 so far this fall with the only loss to Yreka, a California school. One of the Crusader triumphs this fall was over Merrill's defending state champs and St. Mary's can look at that result as a hopeful omen.

The Crusaders learned this week that stellar end Ron Daley will not be able to play. He suffered a broken collarbone in the Merrill game on Oct. 31. It was hoped he would be ready for at least spot activity in state title game play.

Another end, Roger Hout, suffered bruised ribs against McEwen but should be ready for Saturday contention. Guard George Lucas has a sore hip from the McEwen mix and had to sit out much of Tuesday drill.

Yoncalla is the champion of District 4 while St. Mary's won in District 5.

Black Tornado Places Five on All-Star First Team in Southern Oregon Circuit

Ashlanders, GP Place Two Each

Medford high's state finalist football crew stood head and shoulders this fall above the opposition in its circuit. But, the Black Tornado did not dominate in the all-star selections to the extent which had been expected.

Still, the Tornado put five men on the first team of the Medford Mail Tribune's 1959 all-Southern Oregon conference football squad. Five other Medfordites were chosen to the second unit.

Chose to the first eleven from District 6 A-1 championship club were the tremendous ends Lowell Dean and Jerry Anderson, sharp blocking guard John Frohnmayer and stellar backs Dick Ragsdale and Dan Sieg.

Two players each from Grants Pass and Ashland and one apiece from Crater and Klamath Falls rounded out the team. Selection was by the coaches and squads of the five member schools. They cast ballots on an all-opponent basis.

Two Repeat Choices

Grants Pass placed tackle Jere Patterson and back Oscar Nealy. The Ashlanders were center George Moses and back Steve Gray. Guard Larry Ryerson of Crater and tackle Gary Hancock of Klamath were others on the crew.

Dean and Frohnmayer were repeat choices from 1958. No player was unanimous but Sieg received 15 out of a possible 16 points. Anderson, Dean and Frohnmayer each gained 14. Since teams and coaches could not vote for their own players, eight votes were the most that could be cast for any one man. Two points were given for first team pick and one for a second team ballot.

In all 48 players got recognition in the poll. Twelve were listed on the second team because of a tie at guard and 25 others received honorable mention.

Second Team

Medford gridders picked on the second team were tackle Dennis Jensen, guard Keith Berg, center Pat McLaughlin and backs Mike Hood and Skip Bennett. Grants Pass gained three berths, and Larry Janssen, tackle Bill Cole and guard Brian Howard. From Ashland were end Verne Speirs and back Bob Voris. Back Gary Johnson of Crater and guard John Hancock of Klamath complete the lineup.

As a sample of the voting, Medford team members picked the following all-opponent team:

New York (UPI)—The odds-makers feel Texas will clinch a Cotton Bowl berth Thursday and Army will beat Navy in their annual service classic Saturday.

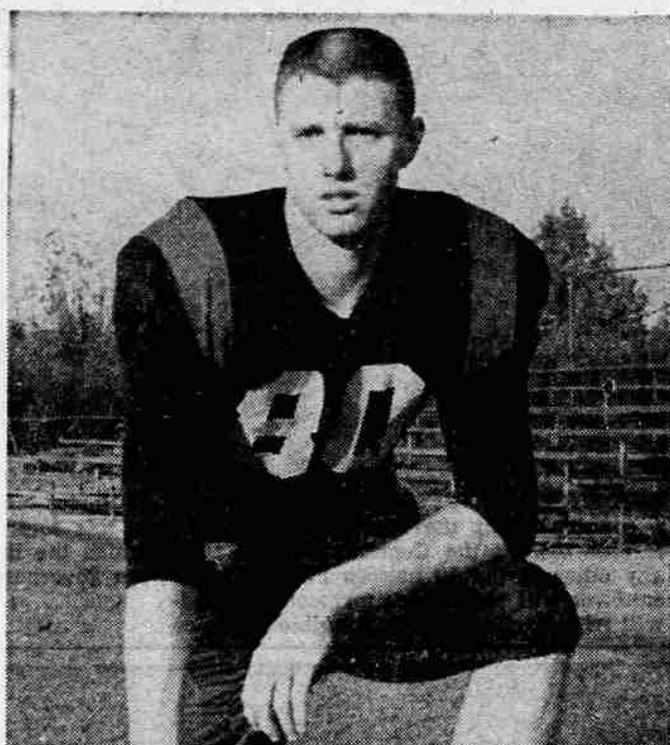

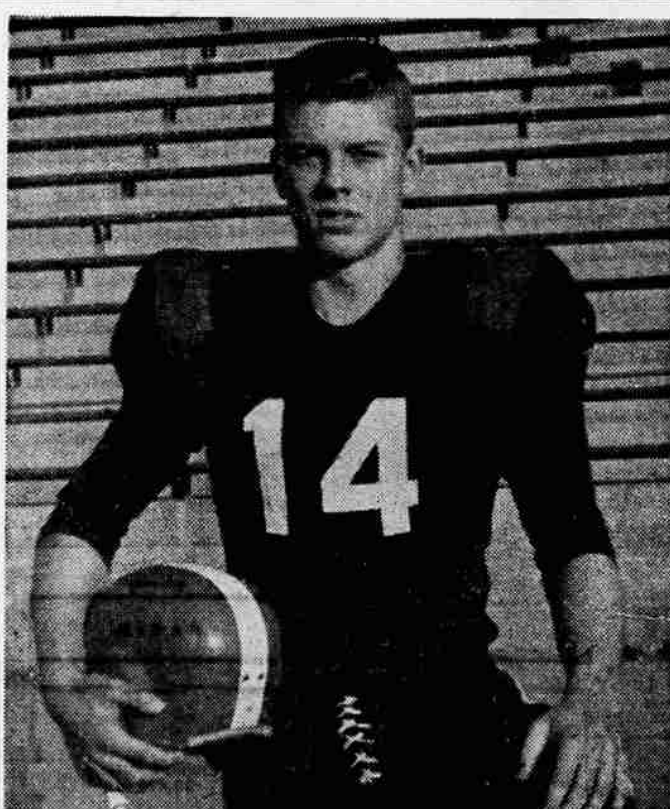

The Syracuse Nationals dumped the Knickerbockers, 120-107, in the second half of a New York doubleheader.

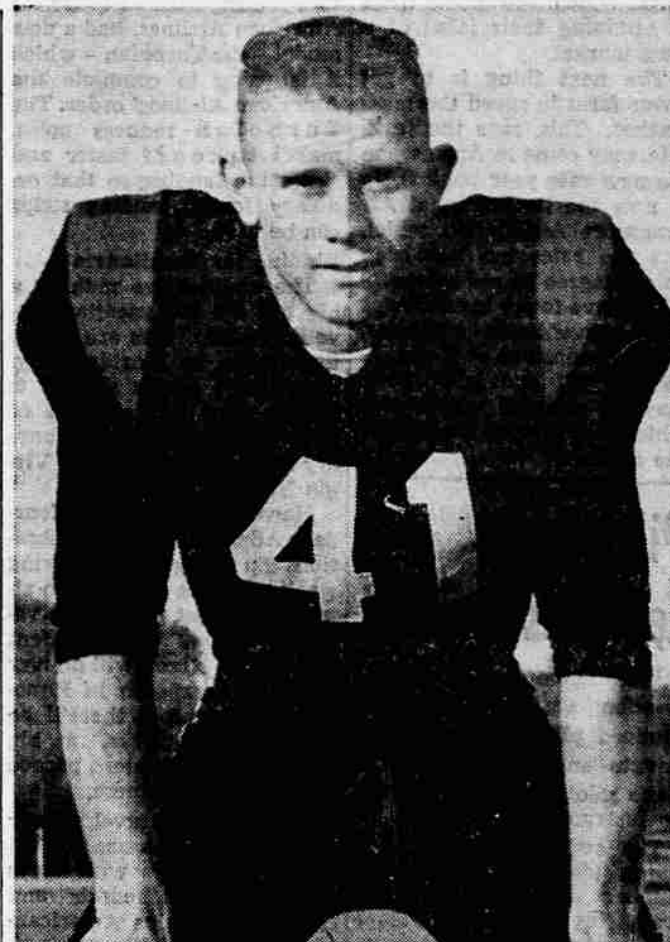
Detroit, increasing its Western Division lead to a game over St. Louis, built a 51-36 margin at halftime as Shue contributed 26 points.
