### Oregon Carlot Shipments Counted

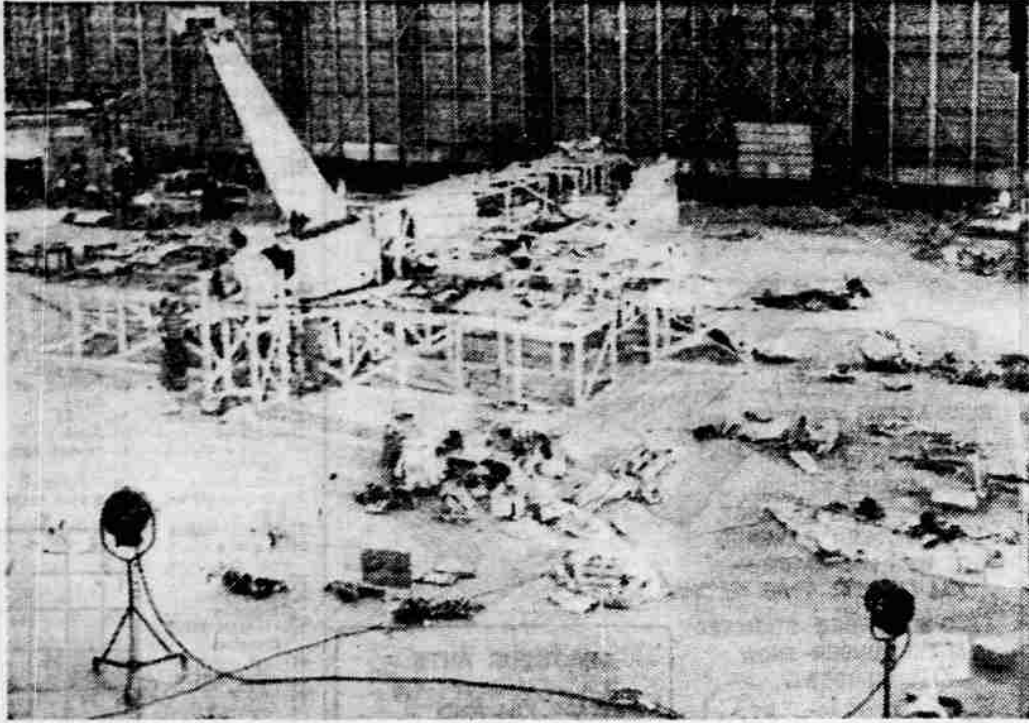
Salem—(UPI)—The Oregon Agriculture Department reported the October total of 6,094 carlots of perishables inspected at Oregon shipping points brought the fiscal year count to 13,991 cars.

This included potatoes for processing and some onions and advanced the total for the year as of Nov. 1 by more than 1,244 cars.

The department said potato and onion shipments reflected the bulk of the increase. Peas were down about 200 cars but filbert and apple shipments gained a little.

The Malheur county shipping district in the first four months of the shipping year led the other seven inspection centers. The Hood River district was up 518 cars and the Portland district was up some 35 per cent. Medford was down.
