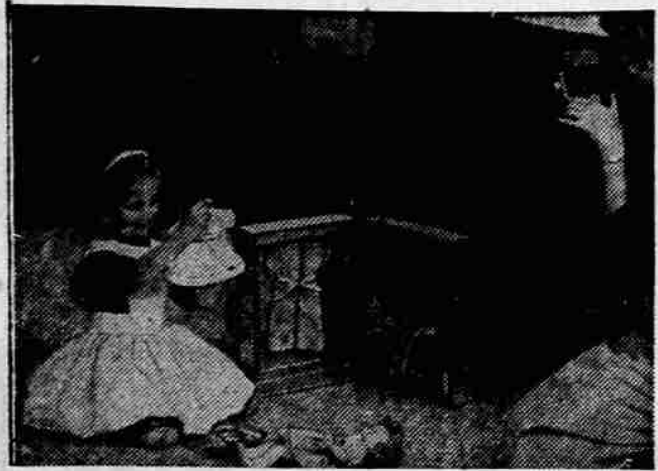

Hotels, Motels Offering Fancy Telephone System

Northlake, Ill. (Science Service) — Fancy phone systems have been developed so that hotels and motels can offer guests the "ultimate in communications."

General Telephone Laboratories, Inc., reported here that a "P-A-B-X" system enables one guest to dial another guest directly, without going through the operator. Further services are provided by 1-digit dialing. For example: "O"—connects to the P-A-B-X operator for making reservations in a distant city; "9"—connects to an outside line for local calls; "8"—connects to room service; "7"—connects to maid or valet service.

"6"—connects to garage for delivery of automobile; "5"—connects to paging service; and "4"—connects to a recording machine which gives a run-down on local entertainment, including swimming pool, shuffleboard, special attractions, etc.

Message Being Held A flashing light on the telephone can be turned on from the hotel's desk when a guest is out, indicating a message is being held for him by the operator.

The guest will not have complete freedom, however. All toll calls are automatically referred to the operator for billing purposes.

Delinquency Book Tells Realistic Thinking of Boys

New York—UPI—It seems to Len O'Connor that "the most realistic thinking on the whole subject of juvenile delinquency comes from the harsh, cynical comments of the boys in serious trouble."

O'Connor, a veteran Chicago reporter for the National Broadcasting Co., has listened to many of these boys. In a book aptly titled "They Talked to a Stranger"—the "stranger" being O'Connor himself—he tells the stories of 10 of them, largely in their own words.

Here are some of the things they said: "They don't burn you 'for murder if you are a kid."

"If you ask me, they are afraid of the kids. The cops and their folks and everybody. And the reason is everybody's plenty dirty themselves and everybody's got a racket."

"Listen, there ain't any kid gonna steal and raise hell without some big person who hasn't got enough guts to keep him from doing it."

Many Interviewed O'Connor, father of five children himself, interviewed more than 100 teen-aging criminals for the prize-winning radio series on which he based his book, published by

St. Martha's Press.

An introduction by Sen. Paul H. Douglas (D-Ill.), calls the book a "unique" contribution to the literature on juvenile delinquency, a study as gripping as a novel that "gets at the very insides of his subjects and not only describes what they did but why they did it."

O'Connor offers no pat solutions. His subjects are slum boys, raised in environments that peculiarly contribute to crime. But he warns that the children of the rich and respectable also become criminals. And he points out that most of the children of the poor don't go wrong.

Father May Hold Answer A boy's father, he suggests, may hold much of the answer to juvenile delinquency.

For the youngster whose own father has failed to provide the hero image each boy needs, he writes, that hero may unfortunately be "a perumed roughneck in a \$200 jacket and a white Borsalino hat; an arrogant post-graduate of the criminal school, an ex-con, who has come back to The Neighborhood in testament of the gospel that only suckers work for a living."

Schenectady, N.Y. (Science Service) — A tracking station for space vehicles combining both optical and radio telescopes was opened here.

One aim of the station is to learn how to track in daylight objects that are almost as faint as the dimmest star visible by naked eye at night.
