Tips on Movie Making Given For Christmas

Santas with shifting stomachs, saucer-eyed cherubs, carrot-nosed snowmen and the pyramids of packages that all punctuate Christmas—make it a shutterbug's paradise.

To help you capture the small fry and Santa in action on movie film, Bell & Howell passes along a few movie-making tips.

First, allot no less than 1½ feet of 8mm film or 3 feet of 16mm film for any single scene. That's approximately five second's shooting time. Anything shorter whips across the screen to quickly identify and may add a comic note you didn't plan or want.

Edit Scene

You can always edit an overlong scene, but one that's too short is lost.

Mother hanging the holly wreath on the front door, Gram's stringing colored lights around the house, the family's tree-hunting safari or Daddy trying an outside Santa Claus costume are all good shots.

Second, remember that variety adds tang—variety of angle, scene length and distance between camera and subject. Plan to mix up close-ups, medium and long shots.

For an "arty" effect, you might take up-angled shots while lying flat on the floor, film one scene from atop a ladder, or frame the action with tree branches. Don't include too many clever shots, however, or your techniques will lose their punch.

Making Movies

Remember that you're making movies, not stills. Encourage the family to talk and move about. If you keep checking camera angles and sighting shots without actually filming, they'll get used to your presence and you'll catch them relaxed and even unaware.

You can concentrate completely on subject, too, and not on exposure setting if you're one of the many proud owners of an electric eye camera.

When you get around to making film titles, you can "dress up" your introduction. For a sample, try photographing an ornamented branch and gradually drawing it aside, revealing the title card.

Duplicates Possible
You might make this year's Yuletide film next year's Christmas gift, too, by having duplicates made for friends and relatives.

It's such fun to remember Christmas morning on film... but be sure you are not disappointed. Take care that you have enough light for clear indoor shots, that your film is not expired, and that your shutter is opened properly for the shots.

Poinsettia Named After Ambassador

More than a hundred years ago our Ambassador to Mexico, Joel Roberts Poinsett, took a fancy to a brilliant tropical plant, known as the Mexican Fire Plant.

Returning to his home in South Carolina, he started growing the plant from cuttings he brought from Mexico. Soon the scarlet-leaved plant came to the attention of American botanists, and under the name "poinsettia," it was destined to become symbolic of Christmas.

In tropic climates, poinsettia is grown in varieties of white, pink and yellow, but by far the most popular is the bright red that carries out the color scheme of Christmas.

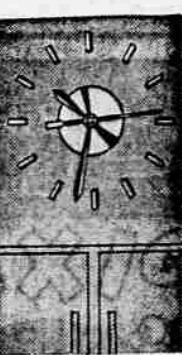

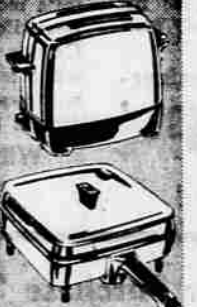

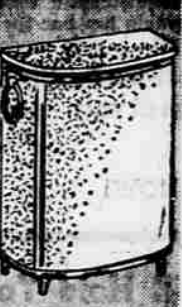
