Police and traffic author-ities everywhere agree that the drunken driver, even the mildly intoxicated one, is more dangerous on the high-way than the speedster, reck-ess driver, thrill seeker or thoughtless driver.

Small metal trumpets that often trim Christmas trees be-gan with a Danish custom. They used to play four hymns on them at Yule—symbolizing

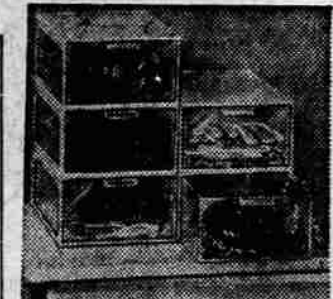

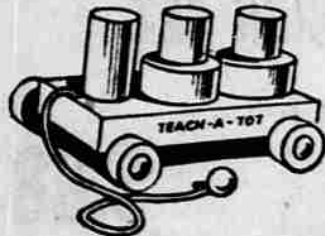
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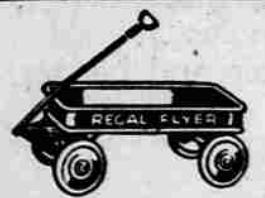
