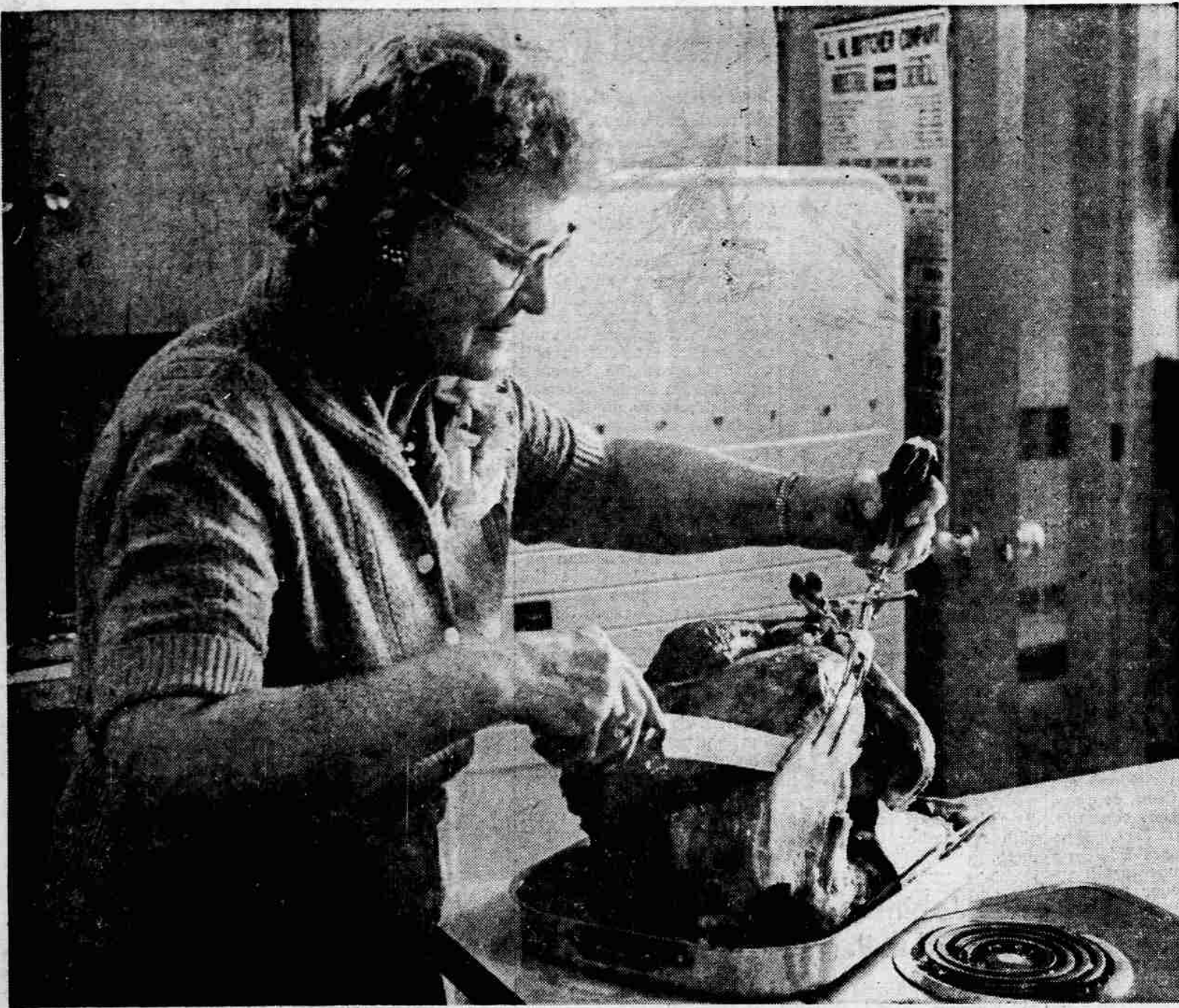
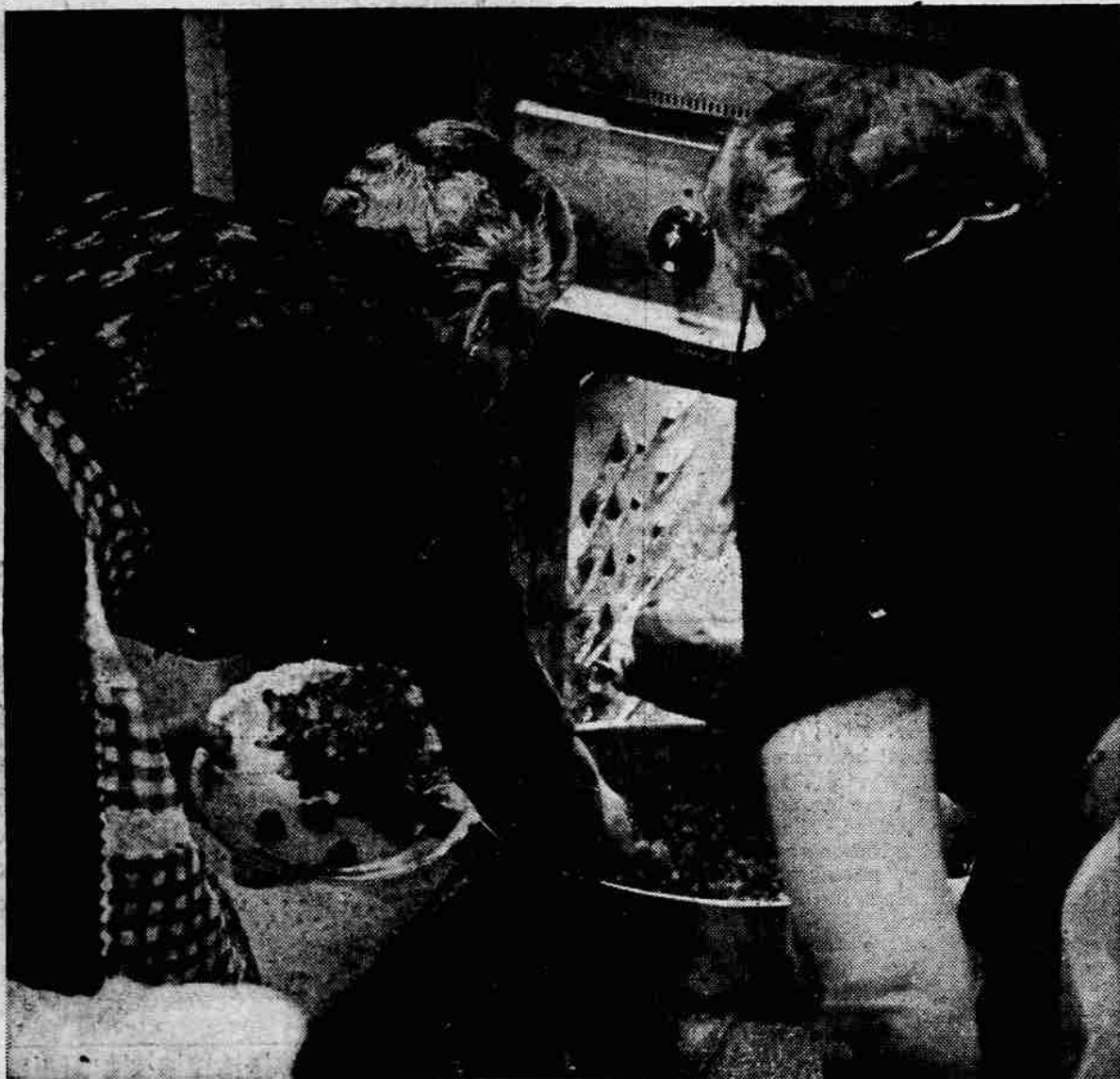


Holiday Feast
