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## Joe Brown Retains Lightweight Toga

Houston, Tex.—(UPI)—"That  
kid," Joe Brown said idly,  
"I'll fight him again tomor-  
row and beat him easier."

Thus he dismissed British  
boxer Dave Charnley,  
the British Empire champion  
who failed to come out for  
the sixth round Wednesday  
night in his effort to wrest  
away Brown's world light-  
weight championship.

It was a two-inch gash over  
the right eye which put  
Charnley out of action with  
his sixth loss in 40 pro fights,  
but there was a difference of

opinion as to how he got the  
cut.

"It was an unintentional  
but," Charnley's manager,  
rudy faced Arthur Boggis,  
said.

**Says Left Did Damage**

But Brown countered,  
"but, nothing. I hit him with  
a left and then a right, and  
I cut him with the left. It  
was as good an overhand left  
as I ever threw."

The victory was Brown's  
sixth knockout win in eight  
defenses of the title he won  
three years ago from Wallace  
Bud Smith. And Brown  
thought it was one of his  
easiest.

"I'd give him a rematch,"  
he said, "but it's up to my  
manager (Lou Viscusi) to  
make the matches. I'll fight  
Charnley tomorrow, any-  
where, even London, if I can  
get the money out of there.  
Just so I get a big purse."

**Preserves Record**

Brown, at 134, scored his  
76th win and his 36th knock-  
out in 104 pro fights. He said  
Charnley, who had knocked  
out 20 opponents previously,  
never hurt him. Charnley  
weighed 133 1/2.

Charnley preserved his re-  
cord of never being knocked  
off his feet.

Referee Jimmy Webb and  
both judges, Ernie Taylor and  
Bill Cornelius, had Brown far  
ahead on points. Webb gave  
Brown four rounds and scored  
one even for a 50-46 tally.

Taylor gave Brown four  
rounds and Charnley the last  
for a 49-46 count, and Cor-  
nelius gave Brown every  
round for a 50-45 score.

A crowd estimated around  
6,500 paid a gross gate of  
\$32,720.

## Ring Title Aspirants Wait Bout

Logan, Utah.—(UPI)—Cham-  
pion Gene Fullmer and chal-  
lenger Spider Webb broke  
camp today and motored into  
Logan for their 15-round mid-  
dleweight title fight (NBA)  
version Friday night.

Co-promoter Norman Roth-  
child predicted a near-sellout  
of 7,000 at the Utah State uni-  
versity field house.

"The gate may approach  
\$100,000," he said, "because  
of our \$60,000 cash advance,  
our \$10,000 worth of orders  
and the increasing sales in  
various cities."

Fullmer said, "I hope to  
knock him out this time," as  
he broke camp at his home  
bailiwick, West Jordan, Utah.

Gene had to be content  
with a unanimous 10-round  
decision in their previous  
fight at Salt Lake City, Sept.  
11, 1958. That was before he  
won the NBA version of the  
160-pound crown by stopping  
Carmen Basilio in the 14th  
round last Aug. 28.

The fight will be televised  
and broadcast nationally by  
NBC at 7 p.m. (e.s.t.) with a  
TV blackout in much of Utah.  
The TV-radio fee was \$100,  
000.
