

**Consumers Should  
Come First in  
Additive Uses**

Salem—UPI—A panel moderated by W. E. Upshaw of Portland, manager of the state agriculture department's Portland branch, decided Wednesday that the interest of the consuming public should always come first in the use of food additives and chemicals which leave crop residues.

Another opinion advanced is that at the same time, it is the responsibility of officials and others concerned to give the public the full facts from which to make an intelligent evaluation to avoid "such mass hysteria as followed federal word that some cranberries were contaminated with aminotriazole."

**Special Feature**

The panel was a special feature of the department's food and dairies division fall conference. Other members included Dr. Harold Schultz and Robert Every, both of Oregon State college; Dr. Elton McCawley, University of Oregon medical school and Agriculture Department representatives J. D. Patterson and George Moose.

Patterson, chief chemist for the Oregon Department, said the agency is nearing the end of its first round of lab work on cranberries sampled from all wholesale channels in the state. No contaminated berries have been found so far, he said.

**Education Board  
Approves 19 New  
School Districts**

Salem—UPI—In another step in the direction of consolidation, the State Board of Education gave its blessing Wednesday afternoon to the formation of 19 proposed administrative school districts in three counties.

The new districts, subject to approval of the voters, include eight in Umatilla county, three in Clatsop county and eight in Douglas county.

The proposed consolidations are part of the Oregon school district reorganization program ordered by the 1957 Legislature. Nineteen of these new district proposals have been rejected at the polls.

When the new law went into effect, Oregon had 708 school districts. Now there are 607 in the state.

**Portland Holdup  
Suspect Seized**

Portland—UPI—Andy E. Spencer, 45, was held under \$10,000 bail today charged with the mid-day robbery Wednesday of the Livestock-Kenton branch of the First National Bank of Oregon.

Spencer was apprehended less than an hour after the bank was robbed of \$1,598 following a chase by a bank officer and a mortician in a hearse.

The robber brandished a gun at Mrs. Gwendolyn Van Antwerp, 44, Vancouver, Wash., saying "give me all your money or I will kill you." The bandit then fled in a car.

Joseph Boyle, assistant operations officer, and mortician L. I. Mikeworth gave chase in Mikeworth's hearse. They lost track of the car but police later picked up the suspect.

Police said Spencer at first denied knowledge of the hold-up but later confessed and told officers where the money could be recovered.

**Oregon Guards  
Respond To Call  
In Practice Alert**

Portland—UPI—Oregon's Army and Air National Guard units performed smoothly in a four-hour practice alert called from 7 p.m. to 11 p.m. Wednesday.

All air and ground units reported and a total of 86 per cent of the guard's 7,100-man force turned out.

About 50 per cent of guardsmen scattered in 81 units around the state had reported for duty an hour after the alert was sounded by Oregon Adjutant General Alfred Hintz.

At the end of the second hour, 68 per cent of the men had reported either to their own bases or at the nearest guard installation.

Once a Year  
The National Guard makes it a practice to stage mock alerts at least once a year to test the readiness of both air and ground units in 39 Oregon towns and cities.

No movement of troops or planes was involved in the exercise.

Originally it was planned to send down target planes from McChord Air Force base in Washington, but bad weather prevented the flight.

Fighter and other units at Portland Air Force base were readied for combat, but no planes took off in the dense fog that blanketed the field.

Notify by Phone  
Headquarters of the 41st Infantry, division here said all major commanders were notified by phone when the alert sounded and they gathered their men by radio, television, phone and other means.

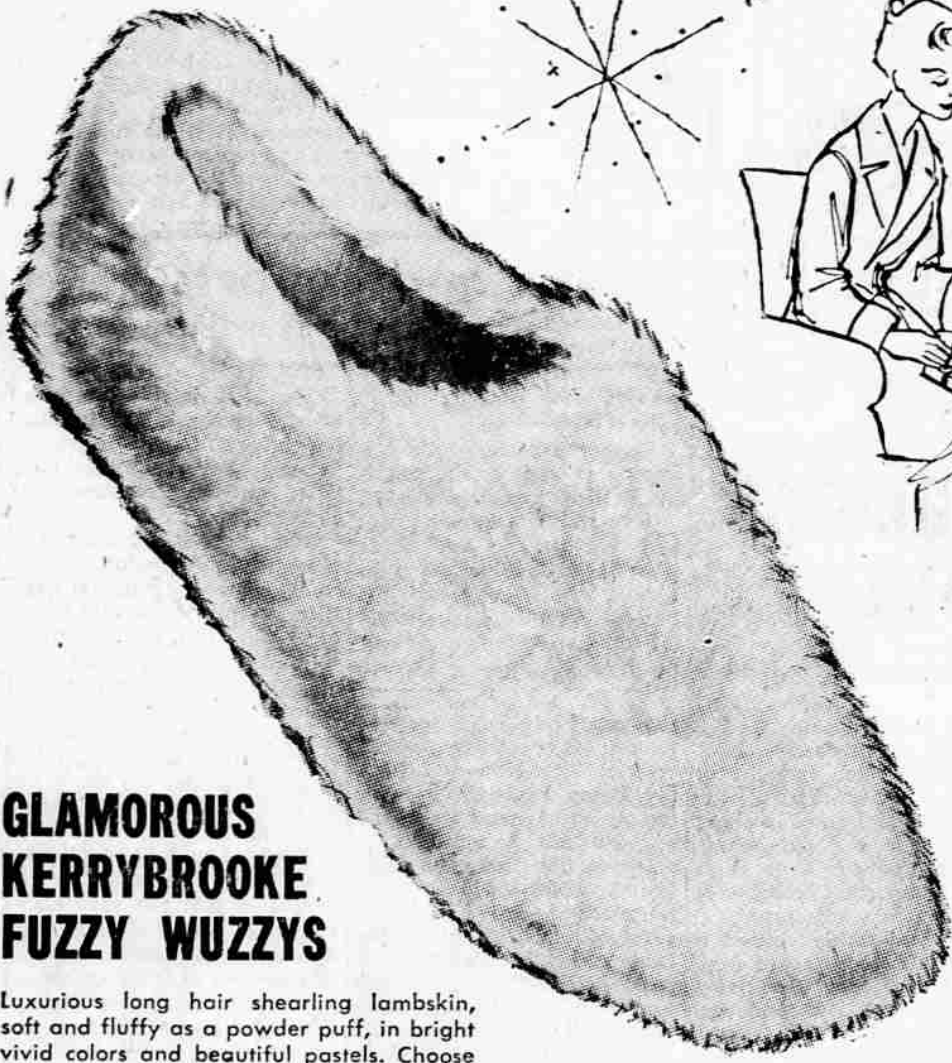
Guardsmen were required to report in person to their units or to the National Guard unit nearest them in order to test their readiness for emergencies.
