New York (UPI)—It is interesting to note that the greatest annual increases in total loans and investments took place during the recession years of 1949, 1954 and 1958, James F. Hughes of Auchincloss, Parker and Redpath points out.

The absence of any bank credit deflation during the past 10 years, he notes, is sufficient explanation of the "new era boom in the stock market."

Past history indicates that until there is a period of bank credit deflation there is not likely to be any serious threat of a major bear market, Hughes asserts.

"Whatever else may be in store for the medically harassed cigarette industry, the fact remains that the cigar business is good and, having no major medical road-blocks to contend with, is likely to continue that way," says the Capital Gains Research bureau. "Moreover . . . cigar stocks are selling at reasonable prices in relation to current earnings, with no fancy premiums tacked on to their shares for future growth such as we see in so many other stocks."

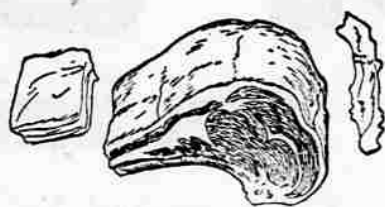

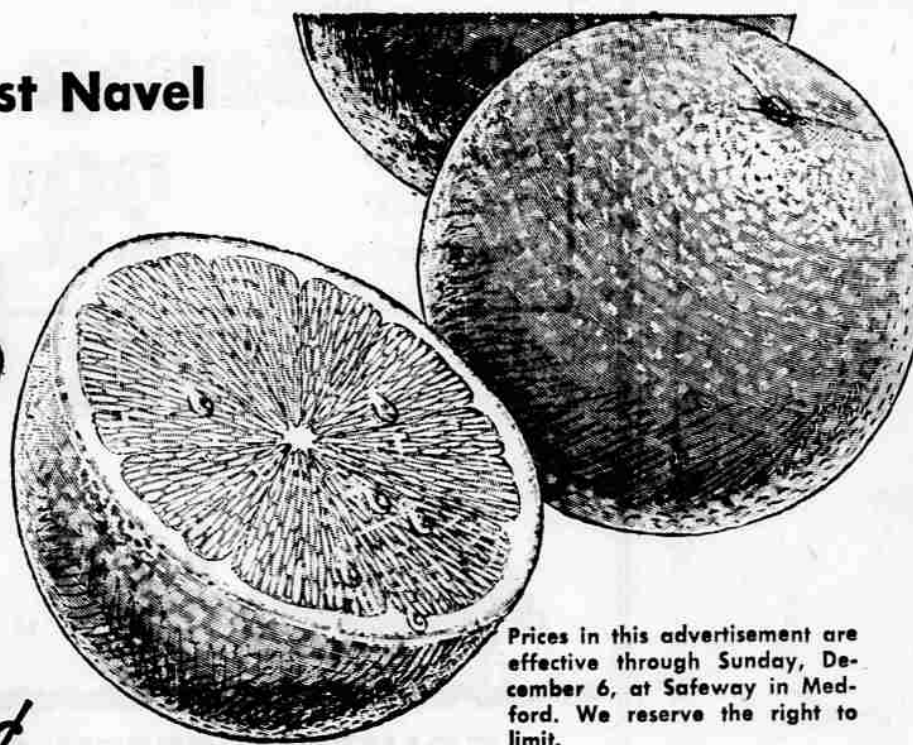
