Finsterwald, Palmer Take Third Round Coral Gables, Fla. - (UPI) - Arnold Palmer and Dow Finsterwald, a pair of young golfing buddies who won two of the pros' biggest tournaments in 1958, tied for the third round lead Saturday in the \$20,000 Coral Gables Open championship.

Palmer, a 29-year-old former Masters champion from Ligonier, Pa., fired a five-under-par 33-33-66 and Finsterwald, last year's 50-year-old PGA champion, from Tequesta, Fla., had a 34-35-69 to share the 54-hole lead with 207 totals.

Best round of the day, however, was a 64 by Miller Barber, a 27-year-old rookie pro from El Dorado, Ark. Barber's seven-under-par 31 round, which included eight birdies and a bogey, was one stroke higher than the competitive course record of 63.

Barber's hot round put him in a tie with Bill Collins of Crystal River, Fla., at 209. Collins shot a 34-35-69.

Palmer, who won last weekend's West Palm Beach Open following a three-man playoff, shot six birdies and strayed over par only once. That was on the sixth hole, where he three-putted from 20 feet.

Maryland Tops N C College Park, Md. - (UPI) - Maryland, at home every time opportunity knocked, outlasted North Carolina State, 33-28, Saturday in the season finale for both Atlantic Coast conference football teams.

Terps jumped off to an early lead on three touchdown passes by Dale Betty, scored twice more by cashing in on breaks, and managed to stay ahead of a dangerous Wolfpack team that fought until the last second to stave off its ninth straight defeat.

In the end, it was old fashioned defensive football that brought Maryland its fifth victory in 10 starts. The Terps' fourth touchdown was set up when tackle Joe Gardi blocked Collice Moore's punt and recovered the ball on the State six.

Maryland's final score, which proved decisive, came late in the third period when State's sophomore quarterback, Roman Gabriel, tried to run wide from his own six and was jolted into a fumble by guard Pete Boinis, who recovered on the seven. Two plays later, Betty went off tackle from the five-much to the annoyance of Wolfpack coach Earle Edwards, who just before the Gabriel fumble had been motioning his quarterback to kick out of danger.

COUGARS TRIUMPH Pullman (UPI) - The Washington State Cougars pulled away in the second half with the aid of sharp-shooter Charlie Sells' 19-points to dump the Montana Grizzlies, 84-60, Friday night. The Cougars, who held a slight 35-32 lead at the half, dominated the backboards and the game.
