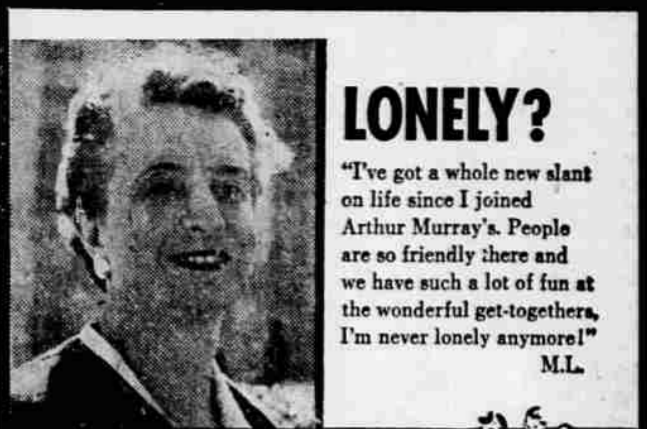
The bridegroom attended Banks high school and Pacific university. He is employed by Gene's Color shop, Forest Grove.
