

Currant-Orange Loaf Good for Christmas
 Try currant-orange loaf for Christmas season meals. It takes ten minutes to prepare and 45 to 50 minutes to bake. The easy "here's how" is: 1 egg, 3/4 c. sugar, 3 c. biscuit mix, 1 1/4 c. orange juice, 1 tbs. grated orange rind, and 3/4 c. currants. Combine biscuit mix and sugar; add egg and orange juice; beat well. (Batter will be slightly lumpy.) Add grated orange rind and currants. Divide batter equally into three well-greased clean tin cans (one pound size), filling slightly more than half full. Bake, uncovered, in moderate oven (350° F.) 45-50 min-

utes, or until cake tester comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes; remove from cans; cool thoroughly before slicing. Note: Batter may also be baked in greased 9x5x3-inch loaf pan. Currant-orange loaf is a source of Vitamins A, B, and C, and has about 900 calories per loaf. This recipe has been tested in The American Home kitchens in New York City.
