True Pictures Not Wanted, Portrait Painter Declares

New York — Most persons who have their portrait painted don't want a true picture of themselves, says a woman artist.

Lady Suzanne Wilkins this week exhibited her most recent paintings of personalities of the famous including her late husband, Sir Hubert Wilkins, the explorer.

"People never like a portrait which shows them as they really are," she said in an interview at the opening of the exhibit at Hampshire House. "That goes for both men and women."

"So I put the character in the face as I see it, but I try for some softness."

Wrinkles in Brow

"Recently," she said, "I did the portrait of a prominent man here in New York, and painted him as I saw him. But apparently I put too many lines in his forehead to suit him." His secretary called up to protest that he did not have three wrinkles in his brow.

Lady Wilkins said she once trimmed down the size of a nose in a portrait of one of

her woman customers. The woman liked the new proboscis in the picture, so much she had a plastic surgeon copy it on her.

The artist said that as a girl in her native Melbourne, Australia, she had done some painting, but only in the last 12 years had she turned to serious portrait work.

She uses a new scale and framing technique on her subjects; instead of the portrait being life-size, it is scaled to fit into a 10 by 24-inch frame.

"Who has room anymore for big portraits?" she said.

"From Memory" Paintings

Some of the works in the current exhibit — those of Prince Phillip, Greta Garbo, and Ali Khan — were painted "from memory," she said. For others, the person posed for the artist either in her New York studio or at her country home near Montrose, Pa.

One of the done-from-life works includes a nude of Hope Hampton, the one-time movie beauty who now lives in New York. Actually Miss Hampton is in a diaphanous negligee, but even so Lady Wilkins considers the work quite an attention-getter.

The exhibit also included portraits of Lowell Thomas, Col. Edward Eagan, Admiral F. B. Warder, Commander James Calvert of the atomic

submarine "Skate" and Capt. Albert Morasso, President of the Circumnavigators' Club. Ashes To North Pole

All five, close friends and associates of the late Sir Hubert, were instrumental in fulfilling his wish that his ashes be spread over the North Pole, the Arctic region which he knew and loved.

Sir Hubert died a year ago at the age of 70, and last March the "Skate" carried out the mission.

Lady Wilkins was an actress on Broadway when she met Sir Hubert more than 30 years ago. She laughingly recalled that her lawyer had told her, "There is an illustrious Australian in town you ought to meet."

"When the lawyer mentioned Sir Hubert's name, she asked, 'Who's he?' 'I was told,' said Lady Wilkins, 'that if I looked at the front pages of the newspapers, I'd find out.'"

"So I read up on him, met him, and we were married in 1929."

"He was the most wonderful man I ever knew," she said.

Stain Removal Tips Given for Furniture

Chicago — Here's how to remove spots and stains from fabric-covered furniture:

Grease: Spread a little chalk, Fuller's earth or corn meal on the spot, then dampen with a good cleaning fluid. Allow to dry and brush off.

Chewing gum and ice cream: Sponge the spot with carbon tetrachloride. For gum, use the back of a kitchen knife to scrape off the remaining substance. Also use a damp cloth on an ice cream stain.

Lipstick: Work a little vaseline or lard into the stain, then follow the directions for removing grease. If a trace of color remains, wipe with a solution of one part alcohol and two parts water.

Chocolate and creams: Sponge the spot with clean warm water and allow to dry. Scrape the spot with the back of a kitchen knife. If necessary, use a small amount of cleaning fluid.

Sugar candy: Sponge the spot with a cloth dampened in lukewarm water, stroking toward the center of the spot. If the stain remains when the material is dry, rub it with cleaning fluid.

Ink: Sponge with a 5 per cent vinegar solution or a 20 per cent oxalic acid solution.

Medicine: Dissolve with alcohol. Coffee or fruit: Sponge

with cold water or carbon tetrachloride.

Mildew: Rub vigorously with a cloth soaked in warm soap suds, then rinse by rub-
