**Care of the Mentally Disturbed Child**

One of the great needs in America today is for well-run hospitals in which something will be done to help the mentally disturbed child, who if allowed to drift along probably will become hopelessly insane. In the Journal of Mental Hygiene for April, 1959, Mrs. Lyons writes beautifully of her experience as a ward-sister in the Nebraska Psychiatric Institute, in Omaha. As one can easily see from her story, it takes a most unusually able, well-balanced, devoted, and idealistic person to help these children, because when a new attendant appears, they do their best to shock and outrage her.

A fact which bothers me much about the handling of insanity in America is that the difficult, undisciplined, hostile, destructive, shy, fearful or criminal child usually has to be brought up, not by someone like Mrs. Lyons who has endless patience and great kindness and wisdom, but perhaps by the half-crazy mother or half-crazy father who bequeathed to the child his or her bad emotional tendencies. So often, as we all know, the child is just a chip off the old block. A bad environment is the worst possible influence for a psychotic child, but a bad environment is what he often gets.

**Youngsters Sprawled**  
Mrs. Lyons tells us how she went into the hospital where she found a number of the youngsters sprawled about on the floor looking at television. Then 20-year-old boys, full of hate and anger and venom, started to fight it out verbally and physically. The others gathered to enjoy the contest. Then, suddenly, one of the boys burst into tears and fled. Mrs. Lyons wondered why these boys had to fight so hard, and so unreasonably. She concluded later that those of us who are sane, remain well, largely because our safety valves are in good working order. We can control ourselves, but these unhappy children cannot. When they are full of aggressive feelings they have to work them out on someone. She tells of 7-year-old Lanny who spent his time spinning around and around like a whirling dervish. He was particularly likely to do this when he was frightened, and he was easily frightened. By whirling, he could sever his thoughts from contact with daily life. Also, when anyone came near him, there was a burst of feces which soiled him and everything about him.

At times Mrs. Lyons thought that some of these children weren't so very different from those she had seen on the outside. Soon she noticed that many of the worst of them were feeling her out to see if she could be trusted—to see if she was on their side, or "just another stinker"—to be feared and mistrusted. One of the girls, a leader among them, every morning used to greet Mrs. Lyons with a burst of foul obscenity. Finally, the child was obviously bothered because Mrs. Lyons wouldn't turn a hair. Eventually, the

girl asked, "Doesn't anything I say shock you?" Perhaps much of what Carol was doing was being done in a desperate effort to gain some attention. Mrs. Lyons and the other teachers, on finding that Carol had a fine singing voice, started helping her to train it, and with this, she became saner. This was a better outlet for her than her obscenity.

**Lost Touch**  
Mrs. Lyons tells how, time and again, through ignorance, impatience, or just a lack of perception, she lost touch with a child whose confidence, for weeks, she had been trying to get. It is so hard often not to offend a "difficult" patient, either a child or an adult. Seeing that the handling of a mentally disturbed person is so difficult, it is a wonder that a few psychiatrists have ever written about it. I have felt that the subject is so important that some of the longest chapters in my books on nervousness are on "handling people."

As Mrs. Lyons says, when she first went to work in the hospital, some of the older workers said, "If you can stand the next two weeks you might make the grade." Mrs. Lyons soon found out how tired one gets when one has constantly to be meeting difficult and tense situations. Fortunately, she felt rewarded by the affection she won from the youngsters. "It is worth the minor hurts to pride, the exasperations, the fatigues, the tensions. The children eventually will learn to exchange fear and flight for love and self-acceptance."

**No Medicine for Cataracts**  
Many elderly people with a cataract keep hoping that they can avoid an operation, but I don't see how they can because, there is no medicine that I know of that dissolves cataracts. Some people evidently have heard of the new and wonderful drug which dissolves the ring that holds the lens in place, but this medicine is dropped in by the surgeon when he is operating; it is not anything that a patient can take by mouth.
