

Sen. Dimick Sees Morse on Oregon Primary Ballot

Roseburg (UP) — State Sen. Dan Dimick (D-Roseburg) said Sunday he believed the name of Sen. Wayne Morse would be on the State's Democratic presidential primary ballot next year.

Dimick added that "I will vote for him and offer him every support."

He made the statement at the Douglas county Democratic convention. Dimick is chairman of the Douglas County Democratic Central Committee.

Morse vs. Kennedy

State Sen. Monroe Sweetland (D-Milwaukie) said earlier that he believed the race for the Democratic nomination in Oregon would be between Morse and Sen. John Kennedy (D-Mass). Sweetland said of the possible Morse candidacy "I don't know why he is running and I wish he weren't."

Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton, a Sunday speaker, accused Gov. Mark Hatfield of maintaining a double edged standard in Oregon by having his own attorney. He said state law prohibits any state official, department, board or commission from employing a private attorney other than one under direction of the attorney general's office.
