Danger Signals of Disease

That my recent articles on glaucoma have been saving the sight of some people is shown by letters I have been receiving. One woman wrote that when her vision began to fail, she went to an optometrist who wisely suspected glaucoma, and I told her to go right off to an ophthalmologist. She then consulted one who, apparently, that day was rushed, because he only looked into her eyes and said she probably would have cataracts some day. But, since her vision was failing rapidly, she decided that she had better see another ophthalmologist. This one, very promptly, used a tonometer, which measures the tension in the eyes (which goes up in cases of glaucoma). He looked into her eyes, and immediately told her she had a serious type of glaucoma which needed active treatment if her remaining vision was to be saved.

I know that when I write alarming articles like this one about blindness I must scare a lot of overly-worrisome people "half to death," and I greatly regret this. Every day, as I write, I try hard to avoid worrying people who need not be worried, but this is hard to do. Often I get letters from people who have managed to twist or extend something I wrote until it scared them terribly. As some of them said, they always had been worrywarts who, if they didn't have something to fear, always could "think something up." I remember a man of that type who, after drinking a little wine with his meals, read an article on the alcoholic gastritis which rarely comes even to those inhabitants of "skid row" who drink a fifth of whiskey a day. Then he read that, with gastritis, one could get a stomach ulcer, so he promptly was sure he had one. He put himself on a diet so narrow that later, when I saw him, he was down to skin and bones. Actually, I found nothing wrong with him except a wonderful imagination which he used for self-torture.

Lump Danger Signal

When a man reads that one of the danger signals that should make a person fear cancer is the appearance of a lump, he needs to know that the several soft lumps which he has under his skin are harmless "lipomas" (made of fat), and the round lump on the back of his neck is a harmless one. He needs to know, also that symptoms that show up in a man of 30 and are not at all alarming in his case, could be alarming if he were to show up for the first time in a man of 60. A while ago I wrote a small book on "danger signals" to help people to see when they should be alarmed about a symptom, or a lump, and when they need not be.

A while back I was much pleased when I received a grateful letter from a mother who said that for some time she had been worried because her little girl of 10 had been drinking a lot of water, urinating a lot, and losing weight. Then the mother saw a column of mine on diabetes, and realized in a minute that that was what her child must have. Immediately, she took her to her pediatrician who said there wasn't any too much time left in which to save the girl's life.

Sen. Aiken's Son Air Crash Victim

Washington, N.H. - (UPI) - Two men including the son of Sen. George Aiken (R-Vt.) were found dead today in the wreckage of a small plane.

Searchers found the bodies of Howard Aiken, 39, the senator's son, and Arthur Tobin, 39.

A third man, pilot Norman Paulhaus, survived the crash of the plane Sunday night in rugged woods near this New Hampshire community.

Paulhaus walked out of the woods earlier today.

State police planned to fly in a helicopter in an attempt to take out the bodies. Paulhaus, slightly injured, was hospitalized. His condition was described as "pretty good."
