Action Wednesday night found College of Pacific rolling over the Cal Aggies 55-37. COP had two men at 6-foot-8 and the Aggies' tallest player stood 6-foot-3. LeRoy Wright, one of the winners' sky-scrappers tallied 17 points to lead scorers and, as unusual, dominated board play.

Raiders Go To Chico For Tiffs

Ashland — Southern Oregon college ventures south for a two-game series with the Chico State Wildcats Friday and Saturday nights.

Red Raider coach Ted Schopf hopes to take his complete squad of 12 ballplayers. Schopf feels the whole team earned the trip after last week end's comeback victory over Humboldt State. Reserves Dick Puhl and Brad Flanary pointed six key points in the winning minutes.

Three times last year the Raiders and the Wildcats met. The two teams split two games at the opening of the season on the Raider hardwood. SOC took one 70-63 and the Wildcats took the other 58-55. The third meeting was in the Far Western conference tournament at Humboldt. The Raiders took the advantage and romped to a 73-57 win.

Set shot Gordy Carrigan leads the Raider scoring now with 32 points in two games. Forward John Payne is second to Carrigan with a 12 average on 24 points. The 6-5 forward has grabbed off 31 rebounds. Don Vannice will be the other forward this week against the 'Cats. He has a 5-point average and 7 rebound record.

Starting at center for the Raiders will be Glen Peterson, a 6-5 post player who is tied with Payne for the rebound lead. Peterson averaged 7 points in the Humboldt series.

Teaming with Carrigan at guard is Dennis Conner. Conner, at 5-11, is making his first bid into basketball since coming to Southern Oregon. He scored eight points in his first two games but six of them came in the second battle which helped the Raiders win 45-43.

For reserve the Raiders will have guards Dick Lillebo, Puhl, and Flanary. Flanary at 5-8 is the shortest member of the Raider varsity and the only freshman. Schopf considers him one of the top prospects in SOC history.

Letterman Dick Smith plays the center spot on the second unit with forwards Tom Berner and Dave Gardner or Bud Kastner. All three shoot the jump shot along with Smith but Gardner can hit the long set shot and rebound consistently.

The 27-year-old Quaker City fighter, third ranked among contenders, belted out a bloody technical knockout over Willi Besmanoff Wednesday night in a nationally televised bout before 7,710 at the Cleveland arena.

Besmanoff, jolted repeatedly by stiff left jabs and hooks to the head, had blood streaming from cuts over both eyes when Dr. M. H. Lambright stopped the fight before the bell rang for the seventh round.

United Press International — Frank Ramsey, the Boston Celtic's so-called "sixth man," strutted like a regular Wednesday night as the defending champions opened a four-game lead over Philadelphia in the National Basketball association's Eastern Division.

Ramsey, a former Kentucky star, scored 29 points Wednesday night as Boston staged a second-half drive to beat the Warriors, 137-116, and even their season series at two-all.

In other action, Cincinnati up-ended Detroit, 129-119, in the opener of a Boston double-header and Syracuse defeated

Minneapolis, 93-89, at Seattle, Wash.

Boston couldn't contain Wilt Chamberlain, who tallied 39 points, but answered with Ramsey's scoring thrusts, plus Bill Russell's 23 points and Tom Heinsohn's 20.
