The Medical Roundup

A Reluctance To Admit One Has Tuberculosis

I am distressed to hear from a man — who recently has been discharged from a sanatorium, with his disease "arrested" — that his neighbors are so afraid of him that they won't let their children play with his. This is stupid and unkind and needless. When a man is sent home well from a sanatorium he should not be feared by anyone, and certainly his children should not be ostracized.

Everytime someone is unkind to a person who has had tuberculosis and has been cured of it, he is helping to build a coffin for some child somewhere. Why do I say this? Because, if many people find out that when they admit to have had tuberculosis they are treated scurvily by their neighbors, then when someone gets the disease he may not admit that he has it, and this may mean that some of his children will get it.

They may then either die of it, or be maimed by it, and much handicapped for life. I can never forget that my brilliant chum in college had to die of tuberculosis; his brother had to die of it; and his sister had to be maimed by a tubercular hip — because their parents would not face the fact that the ailing old grand-

mother, who for years lived with them, was constantly coughing out tubercle bacilli into the air of her room. Under these circumstances, there wasn't much chance of the children's escaping — and they didn't escape. Today the mortality from tuberculosis has gone way down, but still we have with us the problem of those people who are still scattering the disease about in their home and in public places.

About this time the Tuberculosis Society will be asking us to buy Christmas Seals, and all of us should be getting them, because, before tuberculosis can be driven entirely from our land, much more research must be done and more education of the public must be carried out.

The Danger of Great Insomnia

Recently, as I read, one after the other, some 70 books written by people who for a time had been insane, I was struck forcibly by the fact that so many said that what had finally driven them over the edge into a nervous breakdown had been weeks or months of such severe insomnia that they had slept only a few hours a week. As many of these people said, if they or their family and their doctor had only known what insomnia was doing to them, they would have been given enough medicine to make them sleep, and they probably they would have been saved months or years in a mental hospital.

Throughout a long medical life I have become convinced that many people should have barbiturates in sufficient amount every night for a while so that they can learn to sleep again. In thousands of cases I could get nowhere in trying to help a very nervous and jittery and tense woman until I gave her sleep with drugs. And in all my half-century of practice I have seen only a few persons who took too much of the sleeping medicine. They were all odd, eccentric, undisciplined, and not grown-up people to begin with. That is why, when I gave them a dozen capsules and told them to take one or two a night, they promptly swallowed a half-dozen of them. These people were like the alcoholic who cannot stop with two or three drinks, but must go on to take a dozen or more.

In Dangerous Spot

One sad feature about going without sleep for weeks is that then the brain gets so changed that barbiturates stimulate it. As a result, in a mental hospital the doctors have to give chloral or paraldehyde. One thing is certain, and that is that a person who has lost the power of sleeping is in a dangerous spot, and often needs to be treated in a hospital by a sensible and kindly psychiatrist. He must not stick his head in the sand, and hide his predicament from his family and family doctor — as many people do. It is much easier to treat a person with an impending nervous breakdown before he goes over the edge rather than afterward.

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Bright New Comet Seen by Czech

Cambridge, Mass. — (Science Service) — A new comet bright enough to be seen with binoculars has been discovered low in the southeast sky.

Of eighth magnitude, the comet was spotted in the constellation of Libra, the scales, which is visible from the U.S. near the southeast horizon shortly before sunrise. The diffuse stellar object, which has a short tail, will be known as Comet Mrkos after its discoverer, Antonin Mrkos of the Astronomical Observatory at Skalnaté Pleso, Czechoslovakia.

Report of the Dec. 3 sighting was cabled by Miss J. M. Vinter-Hansen to Harvard college observatory here, clearing house for astronomical information in the Western Hemisphere.

When discovered, the comet's right ascension was 15 hours, 4 minutes; its declination, minus 11 degrees, 50 minutes. Nothing has yet been reported about its motion or whether the comet is brightening.
