Projects Benefit Sabbath School Investment Fund

The 1959 investment projects of the Sabbath school members of the Valley View Seventh-day Adventist church have been completed and a cash value of nearly \$1,000 has been reported, according to Clarence Santee, investment secretary.

The investment offering was \$834, with nearly \$275 being contributed by the children's divisions. A sale Nov. 7 netted \$118.30. An additional source of funds was from saving labels.

Many different methods of raising funds for this annual mission offering were used by the members. One lady sold feed sacks she saved; another sold handmade aprons and fancy work; still another sold yogurt. A truck driver was able to turn in about \$20 by giving a dime for each load of logs he hauled. A television and radio repairman gave \$1 for each tube he installed, and his wife gave 25 cents for each day she worked as a nurse.

The children earned their offerings in various ways, one of the most self-sacrificing being that of two boys who went without their dessert in order to have their offering.

The investment offering is added to the regular mission offerings of the Sabbath school to help support Seventh-day Adventist missions in 183 of the 205 countries of the world and in 726 languages.
