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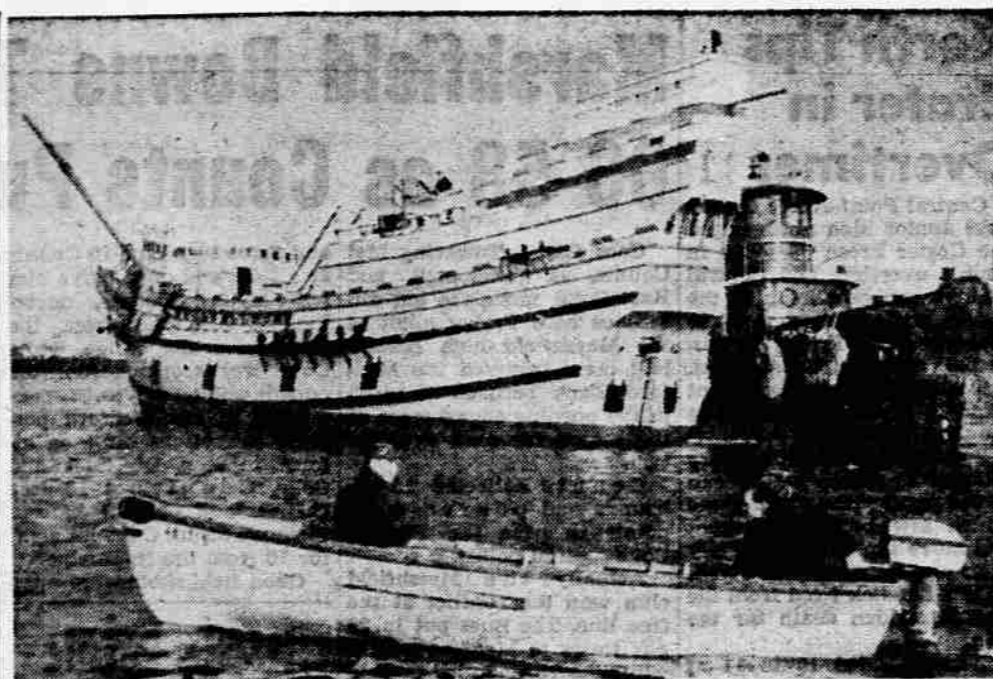

EARLY SURVEYS RUGGED

Land survey parties in the early days of Oregon encountered extraordinary and unexpected difficulties. Harvey Gordon, an early deputy surveyor, reported he had worn out his first lot of helpers by using them as pack animals over the coast mountains, "it being impossible there to use horses"; his second lot of men "took the gold fever," and wages went up from \$52 a month to \$100. His work so far had cost him \$930, which was \$290 more than his contract, and to prevent further loss he asked to be allowed to relinquish the remainder of the unertaking. Perhaps this helps to explain some of the problems faced by map makers, title companies, and others working from plats of these early surveys.
