Cranberry and Apples Good Deep Dish Pie

New York - (UP) - The cranberry, one of America's three native fruits, teams up deliciously with apples for a deep dish pie.

Combine 6 cups of sliced fresh apples with 1 1/2 cups of fresh cranberries in a 10x6 1/2 x 2-inch casserole. Sprinkle with a mixture of 1 1/3 cups of sugar, 1/2 teaspoon of ground cinnamon, 1/4 cup of flour and 1/4 teaspoon of salt. Dot with 2 tablespoons of butter or margarine.

Cover with 1/2-inch-thick pastry, using 1 cup of flour. Trim, turn under and flute edge. Cut 2 or 3 gashes in top to allow steam to escape. Bake 15 minutes in a preheated 425-degree oven, reduce the heat to 350 degrees and continue baking about 40 minutes. Serves 6 to 8.

Frigid Peas

New York - (UP) - Loose frozen peas can be added to casserole dishes without defrosting. If peas are frozen in a block, heat in 2 tablespoons of water just long enough to separate. When preheated sauce is used in the casserole, the peas will cook in 25 minutes at 375 degrees.

Quick Meat Pie
New York - (UP) - Make meat pie speedily with canned beef stew. Blend 1/4 tablespoons of flour with 1/4 cup of water,

1/4 teaspoon each of salt, ground marjoram, ground thyme and 1/4 teaspoon of black pepper. Add this to the contents of two 1 1/2-pound

cans of beef stew, heat and turn into a 2-quart casserole. Top with 10 oven-ready biscuits. Bake 12 minutes in a preheated, 425-degree oven.

Cover with metal foil and continue baking 10 to 15-minutes more to cook the biscuit dough thoroughly. Serves 6 to 8 persons.
