The program itself is a four-point campaign to publicize, educate consumers, conduct research, and promote trade relations for beef, Oregon's leading farm product with an annual sales volume of \$80 million, according to the council.

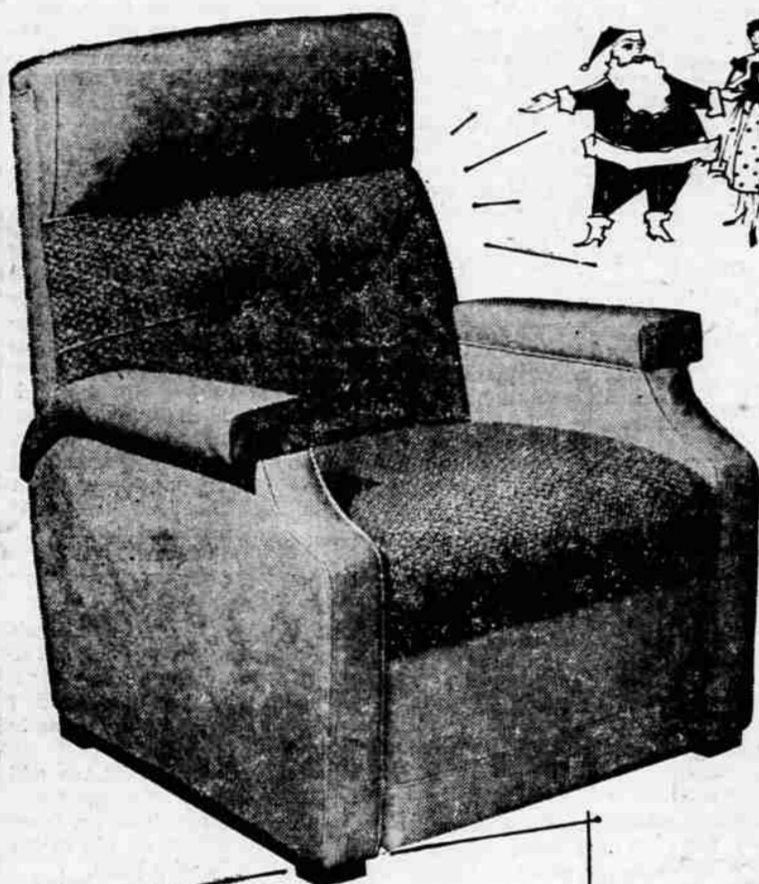

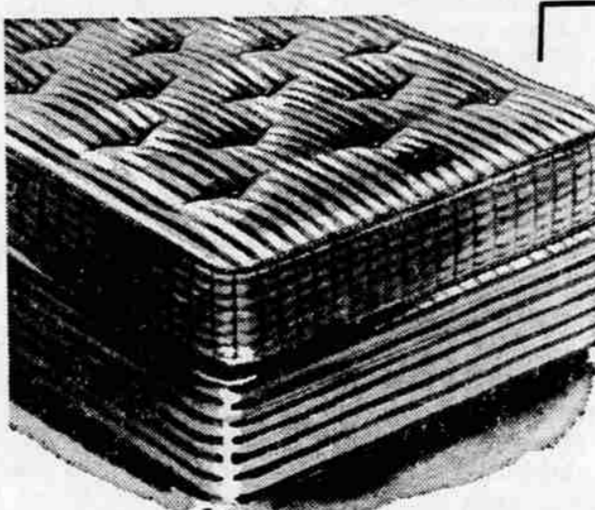

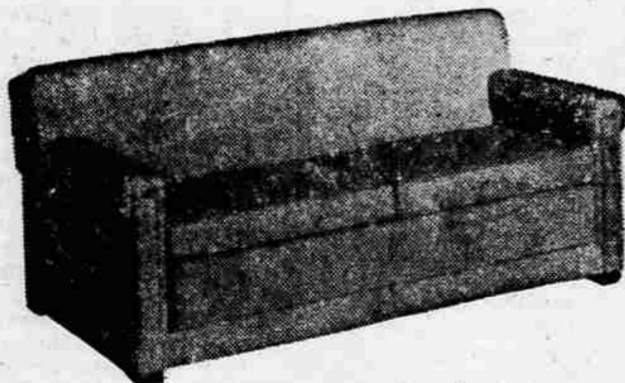
