Titleholder Stopped by Thompson

New York — (UPI) — Frederick Thompson's sensational fourth-round non-title knock-out over champion Don Jordan at Buenos Aires Saturday night, had the following repercussions in the welterweight world today:

—Thompson, 32-year-old champion of Argentina, demanded a shot at Jordan's 147-pound crown, and manager Tito Lectorre is appealing to our National Boxing Assn. to arrange the fight.

—Jordan of Los Angeles, who suffered his first kayo, says he's committed to a January defense against Carmen Basilio, and "naturally" Thompson will have to wait for a while.

—Basilio, ex-welterweight and middleweight champion, announced at his home in Chittanooga, N.Y., "I'm going to fight again instead of retiring."

Jordan, on a South American boxing tour, tangled with Panama-born Thompson of Argentina before 20,000 in Luna Park at Buenos Aires, Saturday night. Thompson, a fleet-footed, in-and-out counter-puncher took command in the third round. He gave Don a severe battering in that session and knocked him out at 1:20 of the fourth round.

It'll be Chuck Conerly against Johnny Unitas in a duel of red-hot quarterbacks when the New York Giants and Baltimore Colts clash for the second straight year as the climax to another record National Football league season.

Both stars demonstrated over the week end that they are ready for the big show—old pro Conerly throwing two touchdown passes as the Giants beat the Washington Redskins, 24-10, Sunday, and young super-star Unitas hurling three scoring passes when the Colts clinched the Western division crown with a 45-26 triumph over the Los Angeles Rams, Saturday.

The decks thus were cleared for a replay of last year's famous "sudden death" overtime won by the Colts, 30-24, at Yankee stadium. The teams have two weeks to prepare for this year's showdown in Baltimore, Dec. 27.

A total of 315,320 fans turned out for the final week

end of the regular season raising the league's season attendance to a new mark of 3,321,444. The old mark of 3,006,124 was set in 1958.

Browns Whip Eagles
The Cleveland Browns defeated the Philadelphia Eagles, 28-21, the Chicago Bears beat the Detroit Lions, 25-14, the Green Bay Packers routed the San Francisco Forty-Niners 36-14, and the Pittsburgh Steelers scored a 35-20 victory over the Chicago Cardinals in Sunday's other wind-up games.

The Giants became the first NFL team to win 10 games in a season since 1953 when they rallied from a 10-7 half-time deficit at Washington, D.C.

The Colts trailed going into the final period, 26-24, Saturday but Unitas' third touchdown pass of the game put them in front and they added two clinching six-pointers in a 21-point fourth-period burst.

Brown Scores Twice
Jimmy Brown scored two touchdowns on short bursts and gained 152 yards in 33 carries as the Browns tied the Eagles for second place in the Eastern division.

The Bears clinched second place in the Western division and achieved a seven-game winning streak for the first time in 16 years.

The Packers wound up 7-5 under rookie Coach Vince Lombardi as Bart Starr threw two touchdown passes and Paul Hornung tallied on runs of 13, three and two yards.

Bobby Layne capped a brilliant season by throwing four touchdowns passes for the Steelers who wound up with a 6-5-1 record. Layne, who completed 11 of 19 passes for 201 yards, moved to within 22 yards of the NFL career mark of 22,085 yards gained passing set by Sammy Baugh.

Green Bay Victor Over SF 36-14

San Francisco — (UPI) — Coach Red Hickey of the San Francisco Forty-Niners said today that a youth movement was definitely not the answer to his club's perennial year-end sag.

"I don't believe in so-called youth movements," Hickey said. "I believe in ability movements. If a guy can play good football, I'll play him regardless of age."

The Forty-Niners started out fast against the Green Bay Packers Sunday in the season's finale for both clubs, then played three quarters of poor football to come out on the short end of a 36-14 score. It was San Francisco's fourth loss in its last five games.

"I was very disappointed in that performance, both offensively and defensively," Hickey said. "We fell apart to a certain extent, and I didn't expect them to do it."

Fast Start
The Forty-Niners, knocked out of the running for a shot at the league title when Baltimore defeated Los Angeles, started out against the Packers as if they meant to waste no time in clinching the runner-up spot, and the \$300 or more per player that goes with it. C. R. Roberts, a newcomer to the club, rambled 46 yards for the first Forty-Niner score, then J. D. Smith went over from the 10 to make it 14-0, at the end of the first quarter.

San Francisco, installed a five-point favorite at game-time, was never in the contest thereafter.

The Packers scored two touchdowns of their own to make it 14-14 at halftime, then rolled to three more behind a hard-charging line and the pin-point passing of quarterback Bart Starr.

As a result, the Forty-Niners finished in a third-place tie with Green Bay in the Western division. San Francisco had a two-game bulge over the field only five weeks ago.
