Russia Confident Of Fleet's Skill

London (UPI)—Russia apparently believes its unmatched submarine force could cut the Atlantic lifeline between Britain and the United States in any new war, it was reported today.

The 1960 edition of Jane's Fighting Ships, the standard world naval reference, says the Russians seem to be confident they can prevent the An-

glo-American navies from gaining control of the vital waters near Europe and Asia.

Their fleet of 500 submarines—including guided missile and atomic-powered underwater craft—could, in the Russian view, "wreak great havoc" on the 25 million tons of American and 20 million tons of British shipping, Jane's said.

The authoritative naval reference book noted there had been a considerable increase in Russian naval activity on the high seas in the past year.

Fisherman's Body Found in Chetco

Brookings (UPI)—The body of Vernon Vanderpool, Crescent City, Calif., who drowned when his fishing boat overturned at the mouth of the Chetco river Dec. 2, was found Sunday afternoon.

State police said the badly decomposed body was discovered on Winchuck beach.

Vanderpool and his father, Ray Vanderpool, were aboard their commercial crab vessel "Leader" when it was swamped. The body of the elder Vanderpool has not been recovered.

SEEKS NEW LAW

Washington (UPI)—Sen. Vance Hartke (D-Ind.) intends to offer a bill designed to remove "unjust" limitations on earnings of social security beneficiaries. Hartke said Sunday the \$1,200 annual limit on earned income for such persons penalizes those who would like to continue working part-time.

Civil War Vet Losing Strength

Houston, Tex. (UPI)—Walter (Old Red) Williams, the last living veteran of the Civil War, was losing strength today in his fight against pneumonia.

The 117-year-old Williams, weakened by his fourth attack of pneumonia this year remained in critical condition under an oxygen tent.

Mrs. Willie Mae Bowles, his daughter, said he was "getting weaker."

Dr. Russell Wolfe described his condition as unchanged, but still critical.

Phoenix, Ariz. (UPI)—An American Airlines DC-6 airplane carrying 45 persons was struck by lightning Sunday while flying through a thunderstorm. It landed on schedule here with most passengers unaware of the mishap.

The plane, flying from San Francisco to Phoenix and El Paso, Tex., was struck 15 minutes before its arrival here.
