

College Student Hurt In Saturday Accident

Ashland - A 19-year-old Southern Oregon college student suffered a fractured leg and other injuries late Saturday night when he was struck by a car while helping to push another student's auto on Main st.

Bill E. Moore, Madras, was taken to Ashland General hospital and later was transferred to Rogue Valley hospital in Medford. In addition to compound leg fractures, he received a lacerated wrist and possible torn leg muscles.

The mishap occurred at 11:17 p.m. when Moore and five other SOC students were pushing a stalled car owned by Carla A. Tomlin, 19, Klamath Falls.

An auto driven by Lynden E. Levison, 44, of 156 Seventh st., struck Moore and plowed into the Tomlin vehicle, Ashland police said.

Levison was cited for violation of the basic rule.

Gemert, Holland - (UP) - Five sisters, all under seven, died Friday night in a fire that destroyed their one-room wooden house here.

Industrial Shares Near Record High

Arson Probers Seek Cause of California Fire

Los Angeles - (UP) - Arson investigators probed the cause today of a potentially dangerous brush fire which erupted in the exclusive Coldwater Canyon area, causing slight damage to actor Charlton Heston's \$150,000 home and one other before it was brought under control.

Three boys in the area were questioned Sunday night by investigators but were released a short time later. Investigators said the blaze broke out under "suspicious circumstances."

Under Control

Some 300 firemen encircled the swift-moving blaze Sunday and put it under control within four hours when strong winds blowing up to 60 miles an hour suddenly subsided.

Heston's home, still under construction, escaped damage by flames which were whipped to within 200 feet of it, but heat from the churning fire shattered several large sections of plate glass. The actor was reported in London working on a film.

Other homes periled by the blaze included those of such stars as singer Frank Sinatra, Ginger Rogers, Peggy Lee

Cardinals Created; Pope Speaks on Birth Control Stand

Vatican City - (UP) - Pope John XXIII today created eight new cardinals, including two Americans, and in accompanying ceremonies reaffirmed Roman Catholic opposition to "erroneous doctrines" of birth control.

The Pope noted that hunger is a "grave problem... for a large part of mankind." "To remedy this most serious calamity one cannot in any way resort to erroneous doctrines and harmful and deadly methods of limitation of offspring," he said.

"It is necessary instead that the riches drawn from the earth be placed... at the disposal of everybody."

Top Story Burned

The home of Antonio Lombardo, former secretary-treasurer of Mexico, was the only other residence damaged. The top story of the two-story dwelling was burned and firemen estimated damage at \$10,000. Lombardo was not at home when the fire struck.

The fire was only a short distance from Laurel Canyon where last July a brush fire destroyed 28 expensive homes and caused damage estimated at more than \$2 million.

The elevation of the eight new cardinals, two of whom are American, increased the number of princes of the church to an unprecedented 79.

The 79-year-old pontiff formally announced the names of the new cardinals to 33 of their fellows in the Vatican's Consistorial hall. They gave ritual approval to the appointments, which had been announced in advance.

Pleased with Meetings

The pontiff spoke briefly in Latin, expressing gratification over his recent meetings with President Eisenhower and other statesmen—all of whom, he said, were inspired by a sincere will for peace.

Seven of the eight cardinal-designates were in Rome for the consistory and subsequent week-long ceremonies that will give them their red hats of office, including Archbishop Albert Meyer of Chicago, and Aloisius Muench, Fargo, N.D., former apostolic nuncio of Germany.

Benson Bristles, Denies He Plans To Give Up Post

Washington - (UP) - Agriculture Secretary Ezra T. Benson issued a bristling statement from his hospital bed today declaring he does not plan to quit, despite GOP sentiment against him in the farm belt.

"Resign?" Benson said. "I am resigned to one thing—to do my duty as I see it—to continue my fight for a prosperous, expanding and free agriculture."

Benson's statement was issued from Walter Reed Army Medical Center where he is recuperating from abdominal surgery.

Renewed speculation about Benson's political future was roused by a new round of requests for his resignation by some Republican national committeemen in the farm states. The requests were prompted by the belief that farmer resentment against Benson's policies was hurting the GOP.

Republican National Chairman Thurston B. Morton, who disclosed the committeemen's proposals, said Sunday that he did not believe Benson would be forced out of the Cabinet.

"Whipping Boy" But Morton conceded that Democratic farm leaders had made Benson a "whipping boy" and identified all farm troubles with Benson personally.

The pressure on Benson has been intensified by the fact that farm income declined 15 per cent this year and is expected to drop again in 1960 to the lowest level since 1942.
