Ernie Banks Ranks No. 1 In Defense

Cincinnati, Ohio - (UPI) - Everyone always talks about Ernie Banks' bat, but official 1959 fielding figures today revealed him to be the No. 1 defensive man in the National League.

The slugging Chicago Cubs shortstop broke two major league defensive records last season and both marks may stand for a long time.

Banks' .985 fielding average was the highest ever compiled by a major league shortstop and the 12 errors he committed were the fewest ever made during a single season by a regular major league shortstop.

Closest one to Banks in the field was Milwaukee shortstop Johnny Logan, who had a .975 average and 18 miscues.

Neves Returns, Rides Winner

San Mateo, Calif. - (UPI) - Ralph Neves, a gallant jockey who has twice almost been killed on the track, returned to racing for the first time since May 30 Wednesday and promptly brought in a winner.

He delighted the big Bay Meadows crowd of 9,082 fans by capturing the third race aboard Pex Vela. It was his first race since he suffered near fatal injuries in a spill at Hollywood Park. His return here occurred on the same track on which he was once officially pronounced dead after a brutal spill in 1936. But he returned from that one, too, to riding glory.

New Boating Act Will Become Effective January 1 in State

Portland-The Oregon game commission has advised steelhead anglers and duck hunters who use boats to keep a sharp lookout in their newspapers or for news broadcasts regarding the new state boating act which will become effective Jan. 1.

Although the new law will affect nearly all boat owners in the state, this group of hunters and fishermen will probably be among the first who must comply with Oregon's boating regulations of registration, licensing, and numbering, since their boats will be in the water for use at the time or shortly after the law becomes effective.

According to the Oregon marine board in Salem, application blanks are now being printed and should be available for distribution about Dec. 15. Applications may be obtained at county sheriffs' offices and offices of

the state department of motor vehicles. Along with the application blanks, a synopsis of the boating regulations should also be available at that time. Distribution of applications may be a little later in some sections of the state.

Federal Act
The act passed by the last legislature, in compliance with the federal Bonner act, provides three documents for Oregon boat owners. These are:

1. Certificate of number, to be issued to any undocumented boat with 10 horsepower or more.
2. Annual license, required for any boat 12 feet in length or longer.
3. Certificate of title, necessary for any boat that falls in either or both of the above categories.

Horsepower is the determining factor in numbering while length is the basis for licensing. Only those boats under 12 feet in length and powered with less than 10 horsepower will be unaffected in any way.

Fees Listed
In other words, any boat regardless of length must be numbered and certificate of title issued if it is powered by 10 horsepower or more. Boats powered by 10 horsepower or more and which are

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12 feet in length or longer must be numbered, licensed, and certificate of title issued. Boats 12 feet in length or longer but powered with less than 10 horsepower require license and certificate of title but need no certificate of number.

The numbering fee for all boats has been set at \$5 for the original issue and good for three years, then \$3 for every three years after.

Annual license fee for boats under 16 feet is set at \$3. For boats 16 feet to 20 feet the fee is \$5. And for boats 20 feet or more it will be \$5 plus \$1 for each additional foot in excess of 20.

For the title certificate, a boat owner will have to purchase up \$2, good for as long as he keeps the boat.

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
