

## Christmas Program Set by Association

A special Christmas program will be presented by the Jackson County Tuberculosis and Health association at 8:30 p.m. Monday on station KBES-TV, when the Madrigal singers of Medford High school will be featured in place of the regular medical panel discussion.

## Vets Responsible For Paying Premium

While the Veterans administration makes every effort to assist veterans in paying insurance premiums on time, responsibility for paying premiums rests with GI policy holders, S. T. Brannock, contact representative, VA Donnelly, Camp White, said Friday.

Veterans paying premiums each month receive annually a packet of 12 cards from the VA. They should submit the appropriate card with each monthly premium payment. Veterans paying quarterly or semi-annually also receive notices which should be submitted with the payments, Brannock stated.

Changes of address should be reported to the VA, but even then it is the veteran's responsibility to make any payment which is due. Likewise, if the veteran fails to receive his premium notice, he should make any payment that is due, furnishing his name, address and policy number.

Brannock said many veterans mark their calendar a year ahead to remind them to make payments on time.

## Phoenix Christmas Program Scheduled

The program each evening will feature a reading of the Christmas story and three selections from Handel's "Messiah." The Ashland High school orchestra also is expected to participate.



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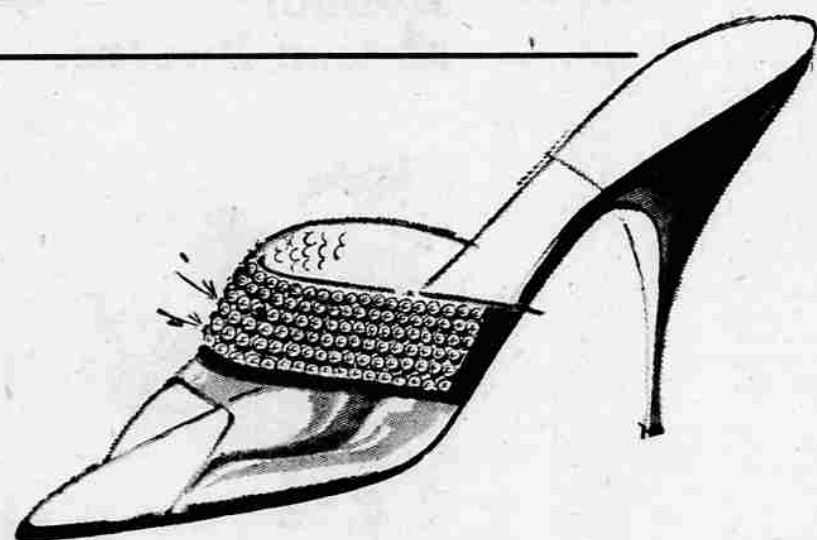
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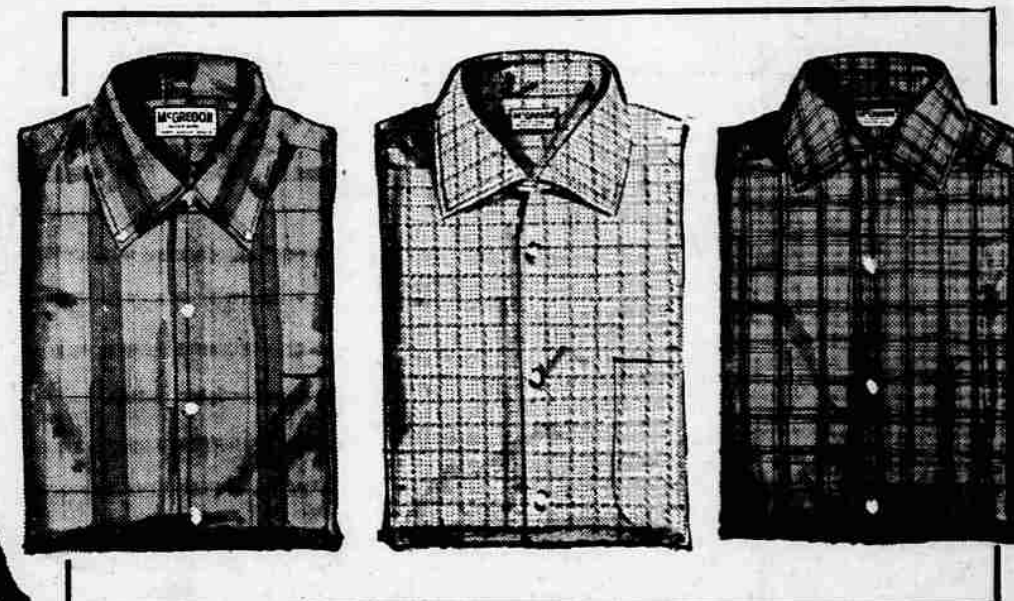
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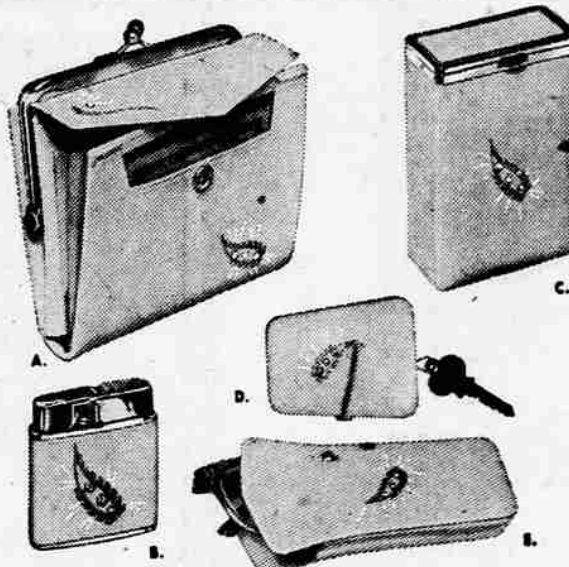


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
