

### 600 Textbooks Due For Korea Schools

Ashland - Korea's war-torn colleges will receive more than 600 textbooks as a result of a 15-day drive conducted at Southern Oregon college.

Students donated books on numerous subjects covered in college classroom during the drive at the college Dec. 1-15.

The volumes will be sent by truck early next week to the Korean-American Scholarship committee in San Francisco and the committee will forward them to Korea's Ministry of Education in Seoul.

The drive was launched by the SOC office of student affairs after a letter requesting textbooks was received from the San Francisco committee.

Twenty-five per cent of Korea's classrooms and 90 per cent of her libraries were destroyed during the conflict there in the early 1950's.

Strobe reiterated that both the shelter and those sheltered passed the two-week test with flying colors.

Boredom, diet, separation from family, and lack of sanitation were the chief complaints of the men.

"C-rations are for the birds. I don't think anything would taste better than a steak right now," was the first comment of Capt. Joe H. Sheard, 28, Shreveport, La., as he emerged. Capt. Sheard was one of two representatives of the Naval Radiological Defense Laboratory who took part in the experiment.

"The most dangerous drink ever mixed is the 'one for the road,' and it is especially dangerous during the holiday season," Chief of Police Charles P. Champlin said today.

Just two cocktails can impair driving vision as much as dark glasses at night do, he pointed out, and added that drinking also reduces a driver's ability to react quickly and make proper judgments.

Because of this, Champlin requests all persons or businesses planning parties in Medford, to keep them dry or make arrangement for non-drinkers to drive celebrants home.

The national safety council has asked its 8,000 business and industrial members to either cut down on the drinking, or cut out the parties, according to Champlin.

Other safety organizations, including the Oregon traffic safety commission, he said, are opposing holiday office parties which result in persons attempting to drive home on Christmas eve in an inebriated condition.

Chief Champlin said he is not trying to dampen the Christmas spirit, but is merely trying to eliminate a source of accidents which disrupt many families' holiday.

### 96 Men Spend Two Weeks Testing Fallout Shelter

Parks AFB, Calif. — (UPI)—Ninety six men have demonstrated with "unqualified success" that they can survive in a 25-by-48 foot fallout shelter for at least two weeks should atomic radiation danger make it necessary.

A group of grimy, but cheerful, volunteers emerged from such a shelter Thursday after a 14-day test underground at this base, about 35 miles east of San Francisco.

They were greeted by gray skies, a cheering crowd, and an Army band which promptly struck up "The Bridge on the River Kwai."
