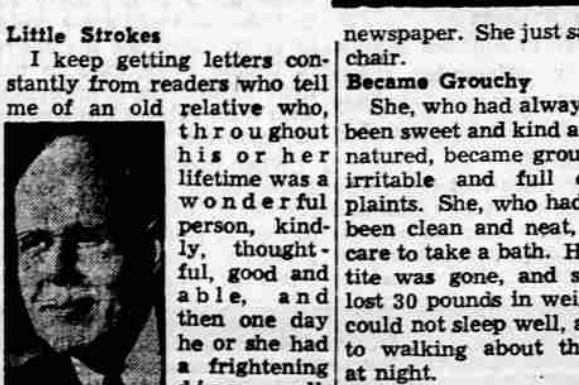

The Medical Roundup

Little Strokes
I keep getting letters constantly from readers who tell me of an old relative who, throughout his or her lifetime was a wonderful person, kindly, thoughtful, good and able, and then one day he or she had a frightening dizzy spell. There came much wooziness; or perhaps the person vomited, or felt numb in an arm or leg or on one side of the face. Perhaps a pain ran into the chest or abdomen.

Perhaps, for the next few weeks, there was difficulty in swallowing, or a vile taste in the mouth, or a burning of the tongue. Perhaps the doctor, who had never heard of little strokes, suspected a bit of influenza, or a "heart attack," and gave some penicillin.

But soon the family realized that there was a big change in their loved one. He perhaps became forgetful and at times a bit confused. Perhaps he came to be a trial to the family: perhaps irritable, unreasonable, cantankerous, "ornery," and hard to get along with, or just slowed-up and unable to work.

Family Became Annoyed
Perhaps over-night he became old; the spring went out of his step, and the expression out of his face. Perhaps he kept complaining about a miserable feeling in his head or his abdomen.

Perhaps the family became so annoyed they scolded him, and said, "Come on, behave yourself, quit grouching, and snap out of it." But the poor man could not snap out; an essential part of his brain had been destroyed. He went from one doctor to another, and took many medicines, but none helped a particle.

Many a correspondent says that now, since reading a column of mine, the family knows what is wrong with their relative. They say that my description of the disease fits their father as perfectly as if I had been talking about him.

Now, the family knows that he is really ill; that part of his brain has been damaged beyond repair by the plugging-up of a little artery; that he is really suffering terribly, and that he should be treated with kindness and consideration.

I was induced to write this column by a letter just received from a fine woman who says that now she is so sorry that, during the last year, she hasn't been as nice as she should have been to her old mother who, on New Year's eve, had a brief collapse in which she slipped to the floor, and for half an hour thereafter could not speak clearly. Also, her hand and her leg on one side were numb, and a little weak. The doctor called it a "heart attack," but next day when she woke up, she seemed all right, and went down to breakfast.

But then her daughter noticed that she was very different. Her former vivacity and her old interest in everything were gone. She no longer took interest in the house. When a letter came from her old daughter, she did not ask about her grandchildren. She didn't even look at the
