Berry, Brown, Huff Head Star Choices

New York — (UPI) — Raymond Berry of the Baltimore Colts, Jim Brown of the Cleveland Browns and Sam Huff of the New York Giants today led the voting for United Press International's 1959 National Football All-Star team.
Berry and Brown were unanimous choices. They were named on each of 31 ballots cast by sports writers who covered the campaign in the 11 league cities. Huff was just one vote shy of being a unanimous choice, appearing on 30 ballots. Berry and Brown were the first men ever named on every ballot in the annual UPI poll.

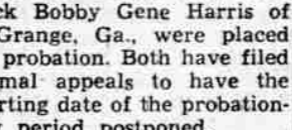
Colts May Use Hand Signals; 3 1/2 Favorites
