Carpet Cutter

New tools which cut carpeting without visible seams, enable worn, burned or badly soiled areas to be replaced. Endless patterns can be achieved by cutting out certain areas and inserting contrasting colors and textures or other materials such as vinyl tile. The carpets are bonded to a curved sponge rubber base, are mildew, lint, and moth proof, and are available in a wide range of patterns, colors and textures. Although the carpets are held firmly in place, they can be peeled up easily for cleaning, repairing or moving.
