

New Business Starts as Result Of Faltering Auto

Sayreville, N.J. — (UPI) — A motorist had car trouble one day in this industrial town, and thereby hangs the tale of a new industry.

David S. Fischman, a specialist in reorganizing sick businesses, was driving through Sayreville in 1956 when carburetor trouble forced him to stop his car. He walked into the office of Sayre & Fisher Co. to use a telephone.

Fischman was familiar with Sayre & Fisher. He owned a little stock in the company which for over 100 years had been manufacturing bricks for the construction industry.

While waiting for his car to be fixed, Fischman had a look around. Company officials told him the brick business was always profitable, but the modern construction industry was looking for new materials.

Fischman was intrigued. Later, he increased his holdings in the company to 10,000 shares, became a member of its board of directors and finally was elected chairman of the board.

Since then Sayre & Fisher has expanded. The most important development has been the organization of its Aglite Division and a wholly-owned subsidiary, Aglite is a lightweight material used with cement to make concrete. It was developed when the decline in the use of coal by industry made it impossible to get the high-grade cinders used in making cinder blocks.

The new synthetic is made by combining granulated clay or shale with granulated anhydrous lime and burning it. It is used in many phases of construction, from floors to bridges.

Sayre & Fisher's Aglite Division is operating a \$1,500,000 automated plant. On a franchise basis the Aglite Corporation of America is contracting to build and equip aglite plants in the United States, Thailand, West Germany, Australia and Canada. Its pilot project, a \$1,000,000 plant at Hamel, Minn., is already operating.

"The picture of Sayre & Fisher today," says Fischman, "is that of an old established business firm moving successfully into new fields. It seems to me that the general development of the American business situation makes this kind of diversification a prerequisite of growth."

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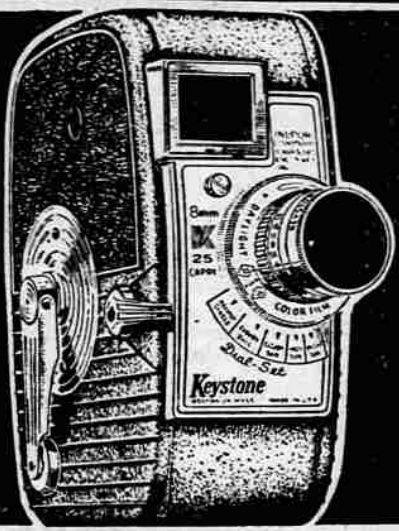
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
