

### Elderly Hungarian Disappears in N.Y.

New York - (UPI) - An aged member of one of Hungary's most famous noble families has disappeared under mysterious circumstances, police disclosed Saturday.

Maj. Geza Esterhazy, 70, veteran of two world wars and refugee from Communist persecution, was reported missing Friday night after he failed to keep an appointment to spend Christmas with one of his daughters for the first time in 19 years.

Esterhazy came to the United States only four months ago from Venice, Italy, where he had lived with a sister until she died.

### Calm Restored to French Martinique

Paris - (UPI) - Calm was restored Saturday on the French island of Martinique in the Caribbean, where a week of rioting claimed the lives of at least three persons and injured dozens more.

Police reinforcements shipped in from neighboring Guadeloupe patrolled the streets. An 8 p.m. to dawn curfew was eased to start at 10 p.m.

The French anti-aircraft cruiser De Grasse, with 20 truckloads of gendarmes and mobile guardsmen aboard, was expected to leave shortly on the six-day run to Martinique.

### Landlady's Order Made Texan Angry

Dallas, Tex. - (UPI) - A young father, fighting mad because his landlady ordered him to stop washing dishes in a bathtub, barricaded himself in an apartment Saturday but police broke down the door and wrestled him out without having to fire a shot.

Milling crowds, drawn to the scene by rumors of impending gunplay, blocked traffic on the street while four carloads of policemen deployed around the apartment.

## Cuba Asks U.S. to Give \$30 Billion to Latin Nations

Havana - (UPI) - The Cuban government Saturday called on the United States to give 30 billion dollars to underdeveloped nations in Latin America.

In a 35-page foreign policy statement, Cuba said the United States should contribute three billion dollars a year for 10 years to her neighbors to the south.

### Tear Gas Subdues Ohio Prison Riot

Columbus, Ohio - (UPI) - Forty of about 340 prisoners at the Columbus workhouse rioted for nearly an hour late Saturday, burning a pile of mattresses in a stairway and beating a guard before being subdued with tear gas.

Guard Paul Blackburn was cuffed on the head and shoulders while being held hostage in a second floor dormitory. He later was removed to Mt. Carmel hospital for treatment and released.

### Miners Ordered Back to Work

Silver City, N.M. - (UPI) - Mine-mill local 890 President Juan Chacon notified Kennecott Copper Corp. here Saturday that he has ordered his 1,800 union members to return to their jobs.

Chacon said the strike had ended and added all workers had been told to report to work with the 7 a.m. shift Sunday morning. However, a spokesman for Kennecott's Chino Mines division said the company is not yet ready to reopen its facilities.

### U.S. Will Renew Deal With Mexico

Washington - (UPI) - The treasury department plans to renew early next week a \$75,000,000, two-year stabilization agreement with Mexico.

The agreement provides that if the need arises the treasury will purchase up to \$75,000,000 worth of Mexican pesos for the purpose of stabilizing the dollar-peso rate of exchange.

It will continue until Dec. 21, 1961, an arrangement first entered into in 1941.

**Accusations Denied**

### Ohio Man Admits Rifle Murder

Plainesville, Ohio - (UPI) - Lake county Sheriff William B. Evans said Saturday night Floyd Hargrove, 34, Plainesville, admitted he was the sniper who killed Charles R. Clark, 35, in his kitchen as he helped his wife fix supper for their four children Christmas eve.

Evans said Hargrove orally admitted the rifle shooting and was expected to sign a statement at a Sunday afternoon meeting with the county prosecutor.

Hargrove, who admitted a love affair with Clark's brunette wife, Lois, 30, told the sheriff he threw the rifle into Lake Erie but deputies were unable to find the death weapon immediately.

### Earthquake Jolts Southern Peru

Lima, Peru - (UPI) - The second severe earthquake in less than 48 hours jolted Ayacucho State in southern Peru Saturday, killing a least three persons.

Seven others had been killed when the first tremor hit the same area Christmas Eve.

The new quake destroyed the town of Pomobamba, which lost more than 250 buildings Thursday, and disrupted relief operations being undertaken by the Peruvian government.

Cleveland, Ohio - (UPI) - A 32-year-old mother apparently went berserk Saturday in suburban Sheffield Lake and shot her three daughters, fatally wounding the youngest, one-month-old Katherine Kistler.

The infant died shortly after she was admitted to Bay View hospital. She had been shot in the back.

Karen, 10, and Christine, 32-months, were admitted to St. Joseph's hospital in nearby Lorain. They had been shot with a .38 caliber pistol.

The house, located on a 35-acre dairy farm, was owned by James Mitchell, 47, who left the place in September to make a seasonal agriculture job in Bakersfield, Calif.

**Tries to Save Others**  
Working the farm while Mitchell was away was his son, Ronald, 25, who saved his mother from dying outright in the blaze. The younger Mitchell told of trying to save the others in the house, including his own two children - Clyde, 5, and Darrell, 3 - and his young brother and sister - Donna, 11, and James, 2.

"The fire broke out while I was in the cow barn milking with my wife," Mitchell said. "My brother (Terry, 15) Hollered to me after he had broken out a window on the second floor and shinned to the ground on a drainpipe.

**Rescues Mother**  
"I raced to the house, kicked in a living room door that had been nailed shut and found my mother on the floor of her downstairs bedroom.

"I carried her outside, then ran back into the house to save the children. My sister (Donna, 13) got out the same way as my brother.

"But I couldn't get to the bedroom on the ground floor where my brother and sister were sleeping or to the second floor bedroom where my kids were sleeping because of the flames.

**House Collapsing**  
"I climbed onto the roof and tried to chop a hole into the upstairs bedroom but the house was beginning to cool.
